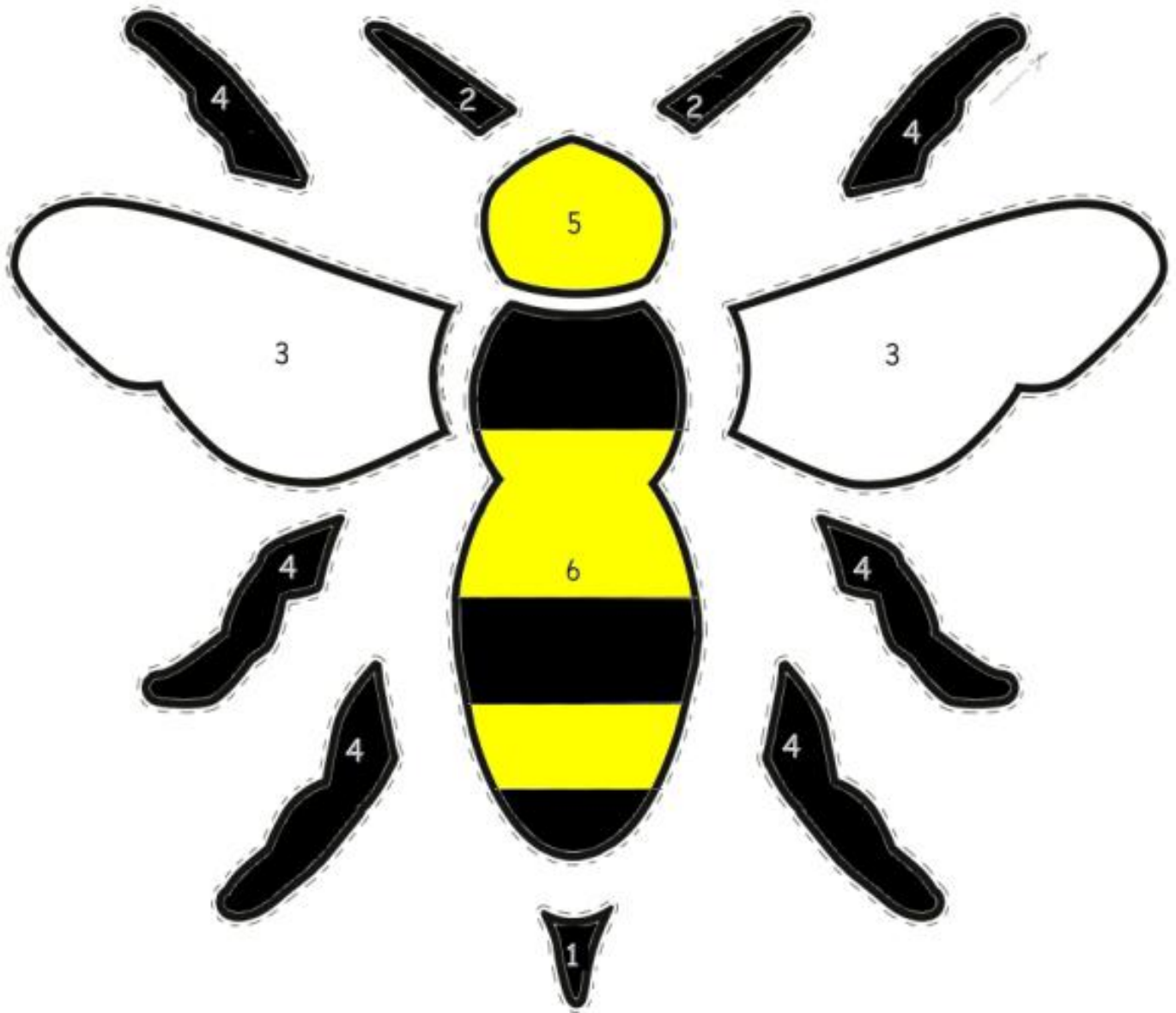
Many of the items will fit in with the Guiding Programme, either as an UMA, A Skills Builder or as part of an Interest badge.

Feel free to adapt the activities to suit your unit. Baker Ross and Crafty Crocodiles also sell a large range of bug themed crafts which you might like as an alternative. Most importantly we want you and your Rainbows to have fun.

Buzzie Bee Beetle (Parlour Party Know Myself UMA)

Use the template to make a bee for each person. Cut each bee up, so that each individual part has a number and place in a central pile. You need one whole bee for each player. We laminated ours to use again.



How to play:

Taking turns, each player throws the die. Need to throw a 6 to start to get the body. When a player throws a 5, they may claim a head from the central pile. They continue to throw the dice until a they have all their parts. The winner is the first person to complete their bee. This is a great game to teach turn taking and rules.

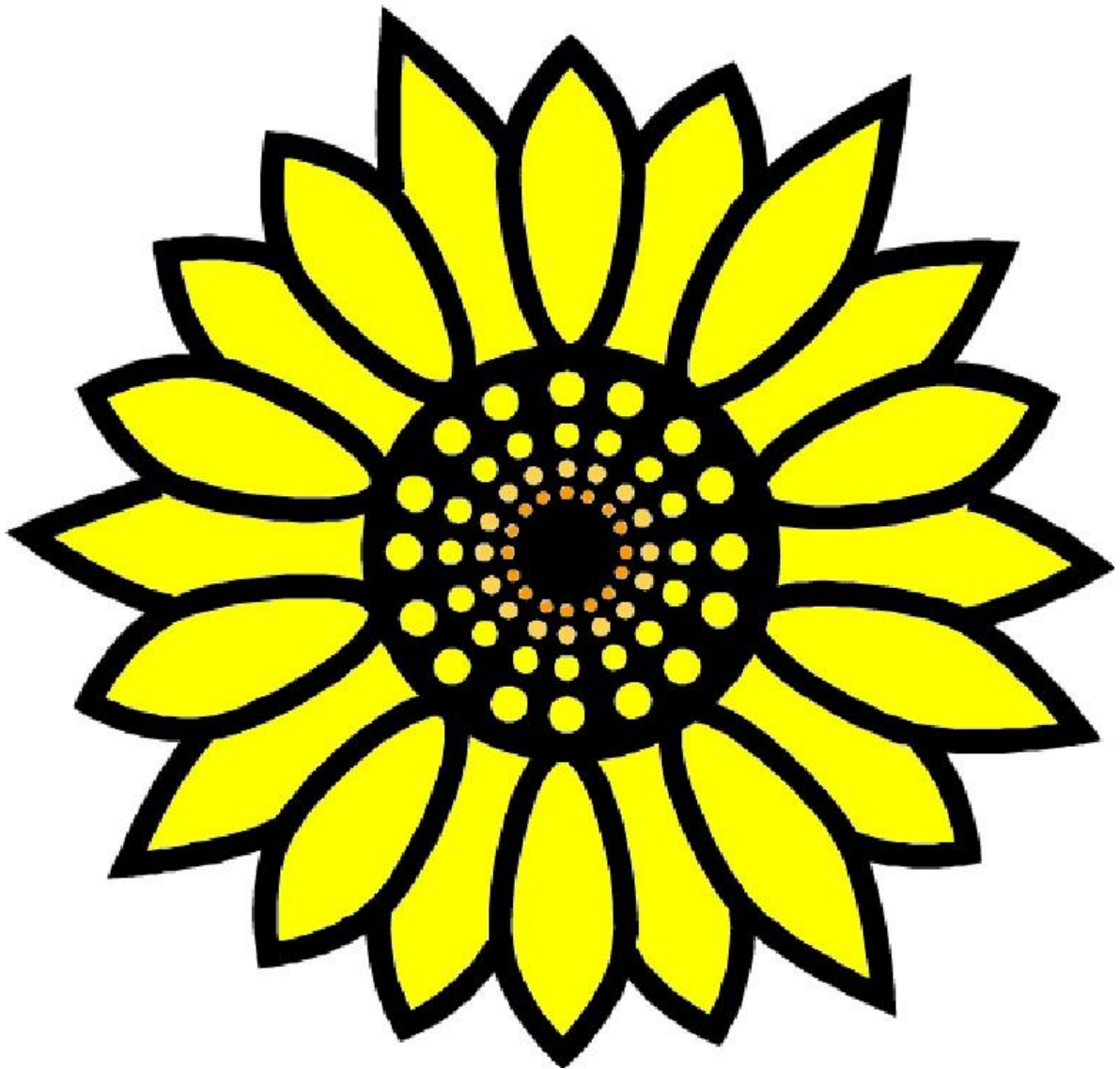

Flowers and Bugs Game

You need

- several large card flower shapes, one for each Rainbow to stand on
- three small bugs made from card or paper



How to play:

Place the flowers on the ground. The Rainbows leave the meeting area or hide their eyes while the bugs are placed underneath three of the flowers.

The Rainbows run around and then each choose a flower to stand on. When a Leader tells them to find the bugs, they look under their flower. The three Rainbows with the bugs hide them next time.

Print the cards below onto card. [2 x sets per person playing] Cut out.



How to play:

Turn cards face down. Each player must find matching pairs, if a player turns over a pair they may continue if not on to the next player. Winner is the person with the most pairs when all have been found.

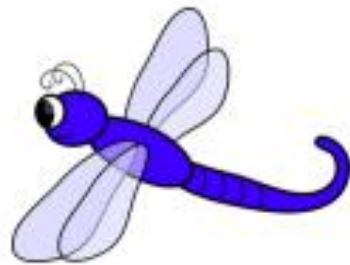
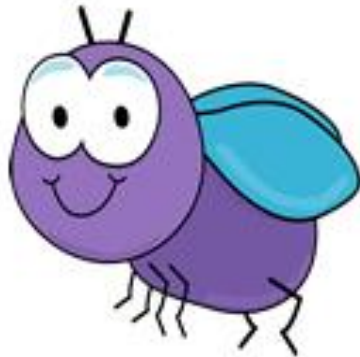
Lady, Lady, Bug

Have children sit on the ground in a circle. One child is "It". "It" goes around the outside of the circle, patting each child on the head and saying "Lady" for each child. "It" will say "Lady" over and over until unexpectedly saying "Bug!" when giving a pat. The "Bug" must then hop up and run around the circle while chasing "It". If "It" makes his way back to the Bug's seat before being tagged, he is safe, and the Bug becomes "It". If not, "It" remains "It" for another round.

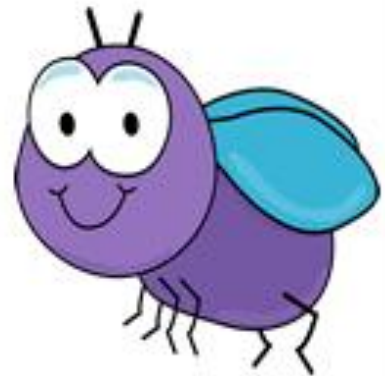
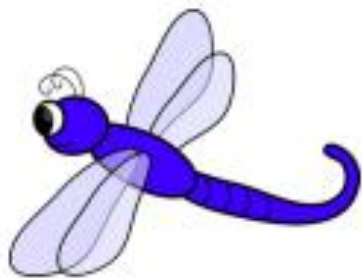
Play Bug Bingo

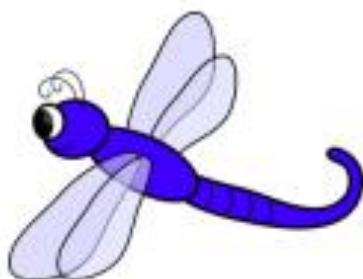
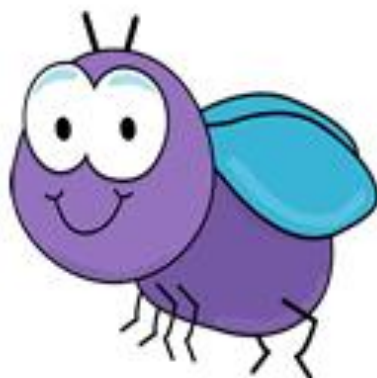

Beeswax candles

Beeswax is made from honeycomb and has been used for centuries in a variety of products, including the mouthpieces of didgeridoos. Beeswax candles can be made by gently warming sheets of wax and rolling them around a wick. Sheets of wax and wicks can be obtained cheaply on eBay. There are also plastic bee pins that can be used to hold the wax rolled into place and look attractive.

You will need red plastic spoons, googly eyes and black pipe cleaners. Glue two spoons end to end with a hot glue gun. Attach googly eyes to head end, wind black pipe cleaner around the joined handles and using 3 more pipe cleaners wrap around the body to create legs.

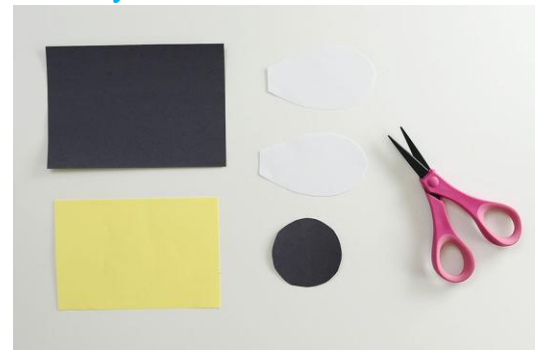
Paper Roll Fire Flies ...They Actually Glow!



- Toilet paper roll
- Black thick paper
- Coloured tissue paper
- 3x black 6 inch pipe cleaners
- 2x googly eyes stickers
- Scissors
- Double sided sticky tape
- White printer paper
- Battery tea light

1.
Cut a hole up from the bottom of the paper roll. This will be the glowing belly of the firefly.

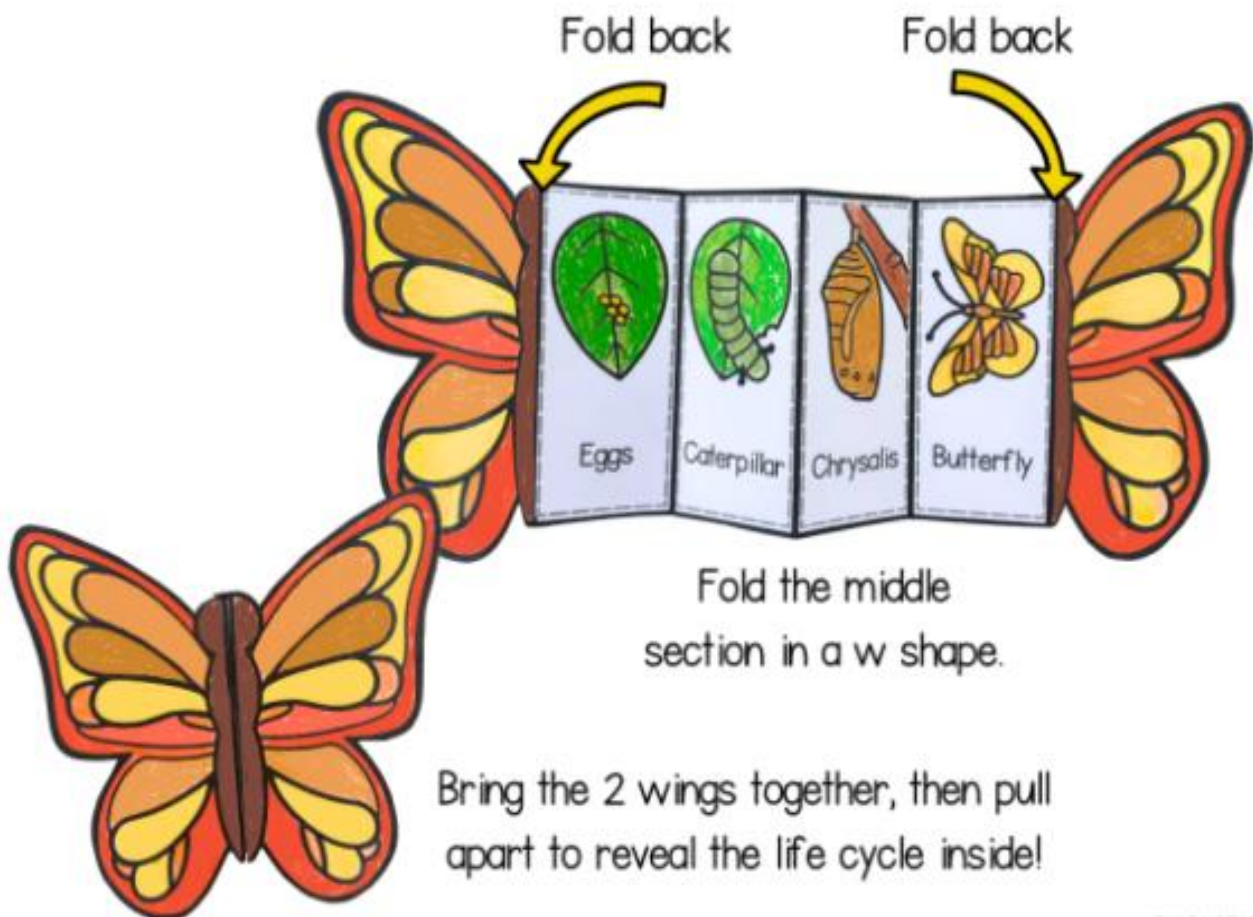
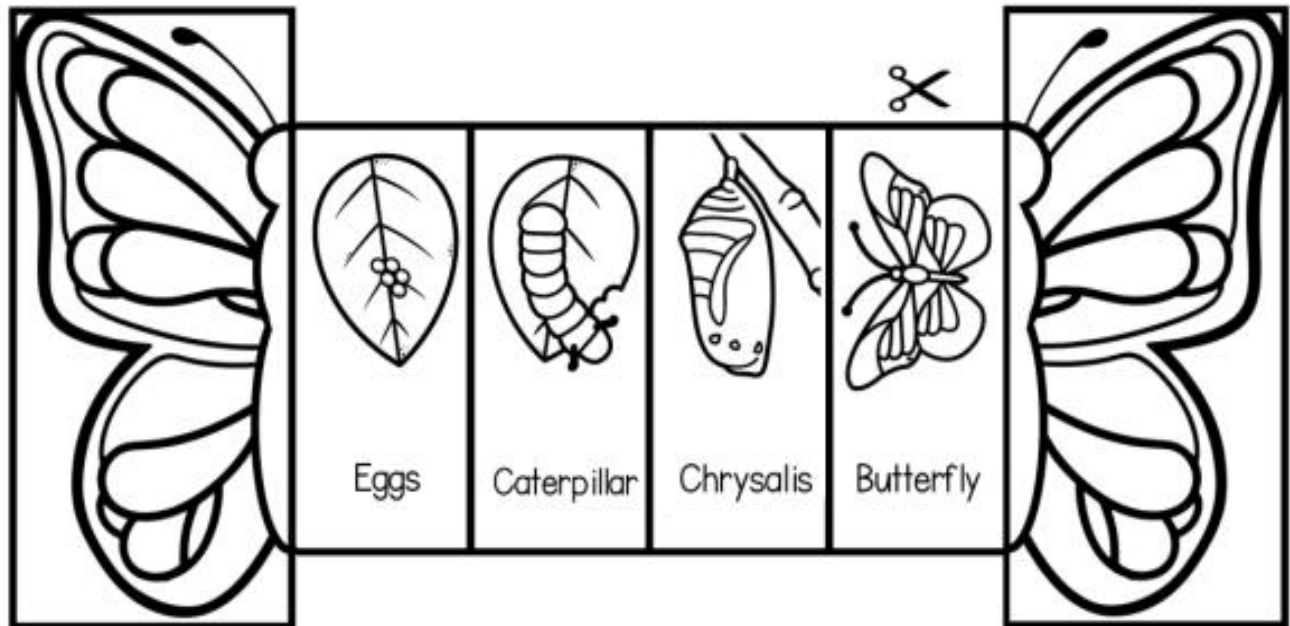
2. Cut out a black rectangle of paper just large enough to cover the entire paper roll.
3. Cut out a smaller rectangle of yellow (or white, blue, green or pink) tissue paper.
4. Cut out 2 identical wing shapes from white printer paper.
5. Cut out a circle from black construction paper for the firefly's head.
6. Wrap the black rectangle of construction paper over the paper roll. Tape it to hold it in place.
7. Cut out the shape of the belly from the black construction paper using the hole in the toilet paper roll as a guide.
8. Roll up the rectangle of paper that will be the belly and slide it into the paper roll. Add a piece of tape to the inside of the paper roll to hold it in place.
9. Attach the googly eyes to the circle and use a silver pen to draw the mouth. Then attach the circle to the paper roll.
10. Take the first black pipe cleaner and wrap it around the paper roll. Bend about 1/2 inch of each end downwards to make top feet for the firefly. Add a piece of tape to the back of the firefly to hold the pipe cleaner legs in place.
11. 1/2 inch of each end downwards to make top feet for the firefly. Add a piece of tape to the back of the firefly to hold the pipe cleaner legs in place.
12. Tape the two wings of the firefly together, then tape them to the back of the paper roll. The wings should cover the pipe cleaner you just added.
13. Make the bottom legs the same as the top and tape into place.
14. Take the final black pipe cleaner and bend it in half. Then pinch each end and roll it into a loose spiral to make the antennae. Tape the antennae to the back of the head.
15. Turn on your tea light and slot your firefly over the tea light.



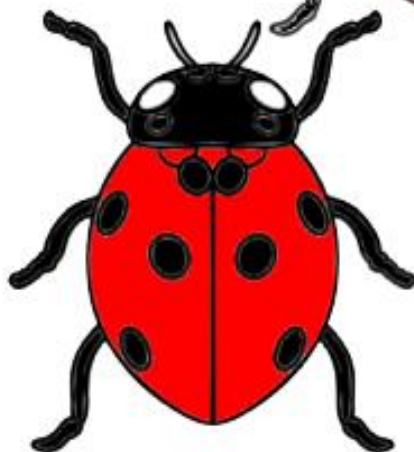
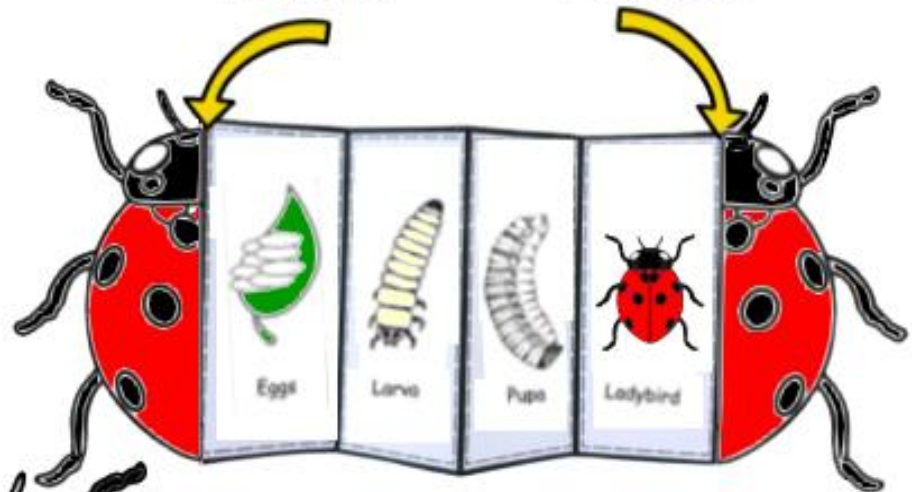
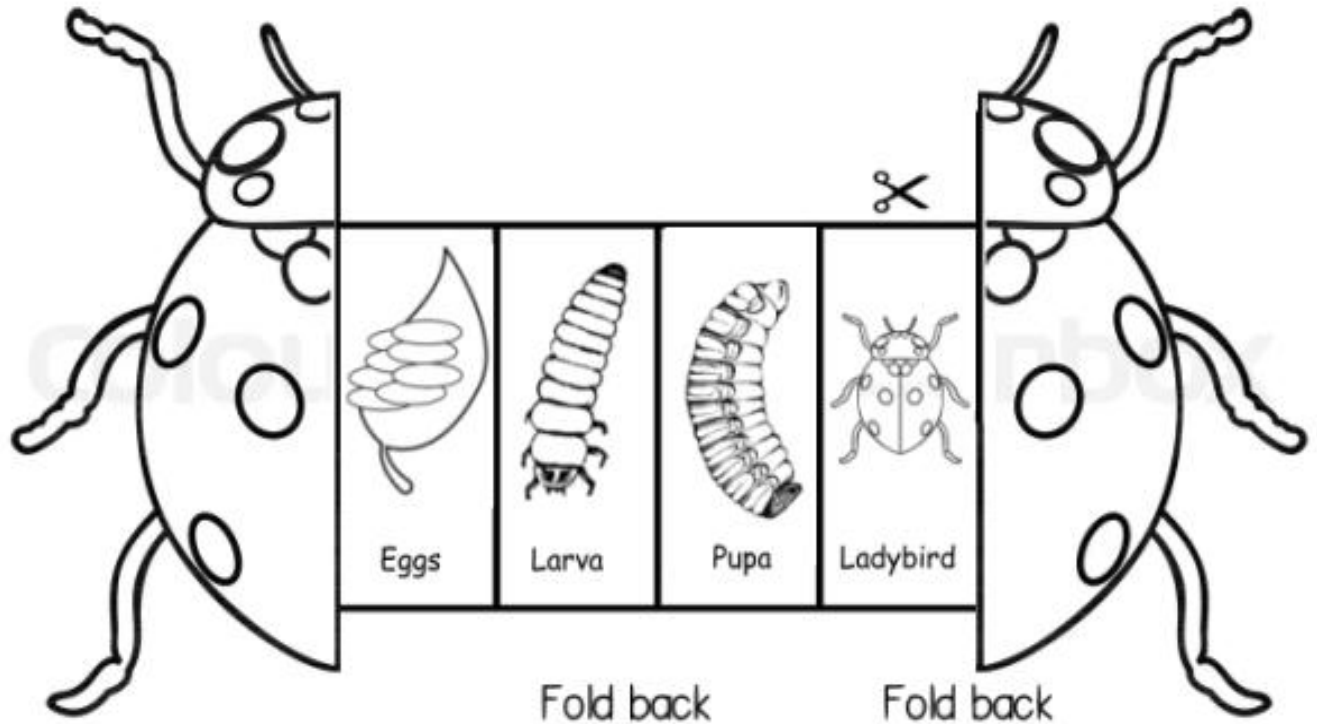

Carefully slide your bug together at the slits.

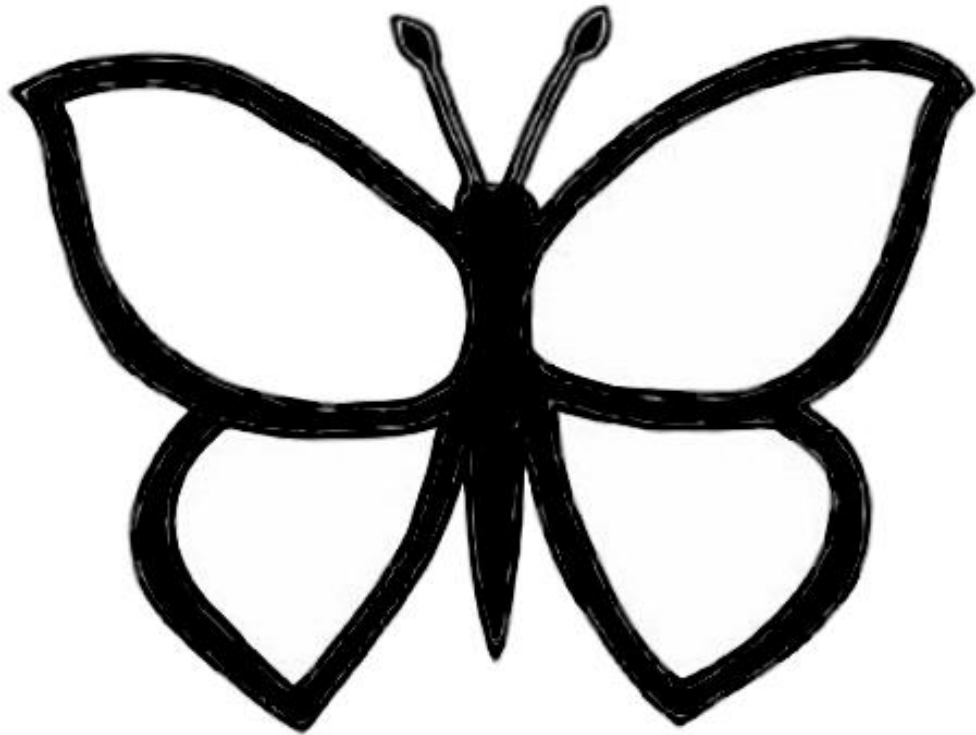


Make a Butterfly Sun Catcher

Cut out the outline of a butterfly and lay it on one side of a laminating pouch. Fill in the outline with coloured tissue paper.

Carefully close the pouch and place through the laminator.

Then cut out and hang in a window. Alternatively, you could use clear sticky back plastic.



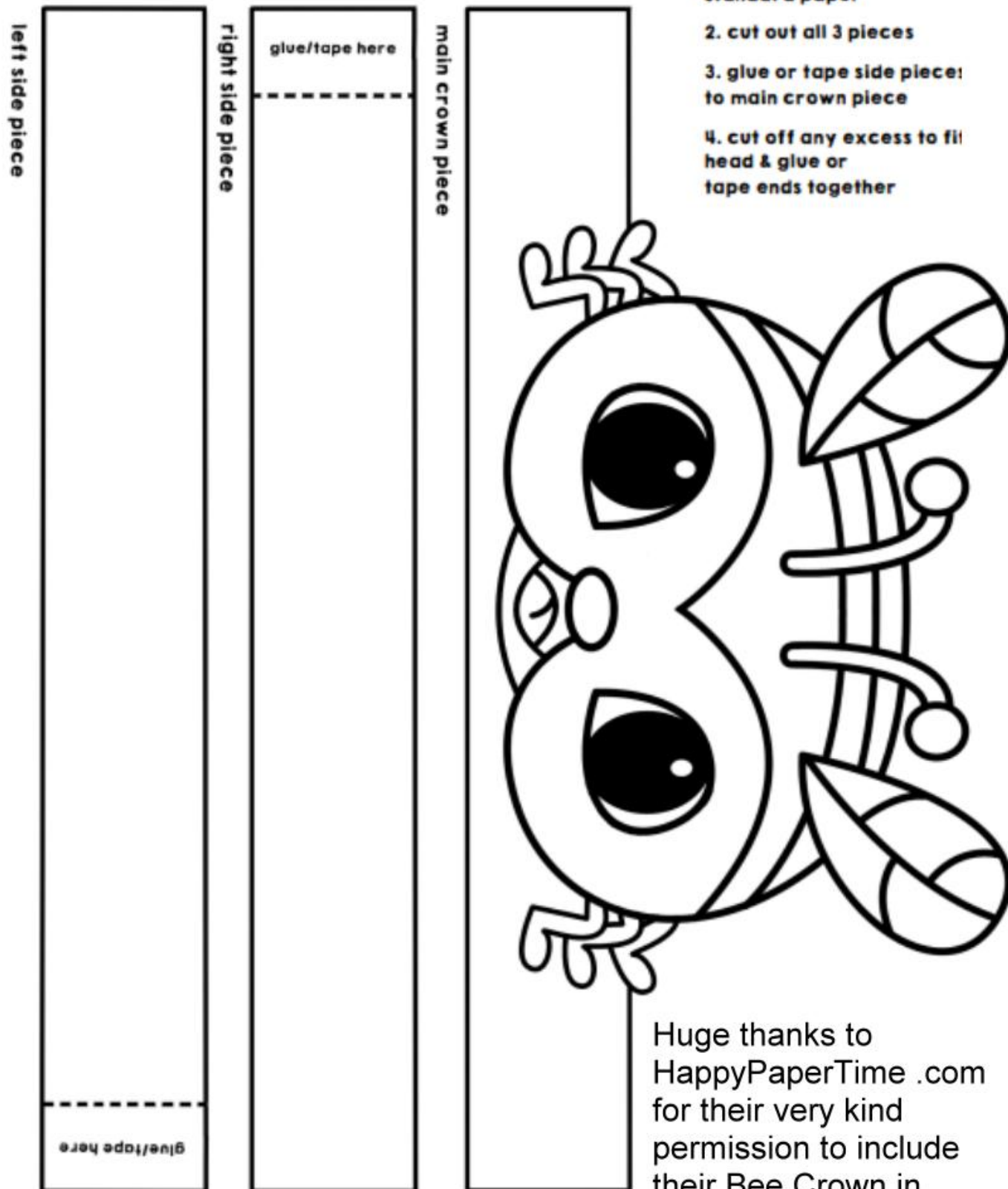

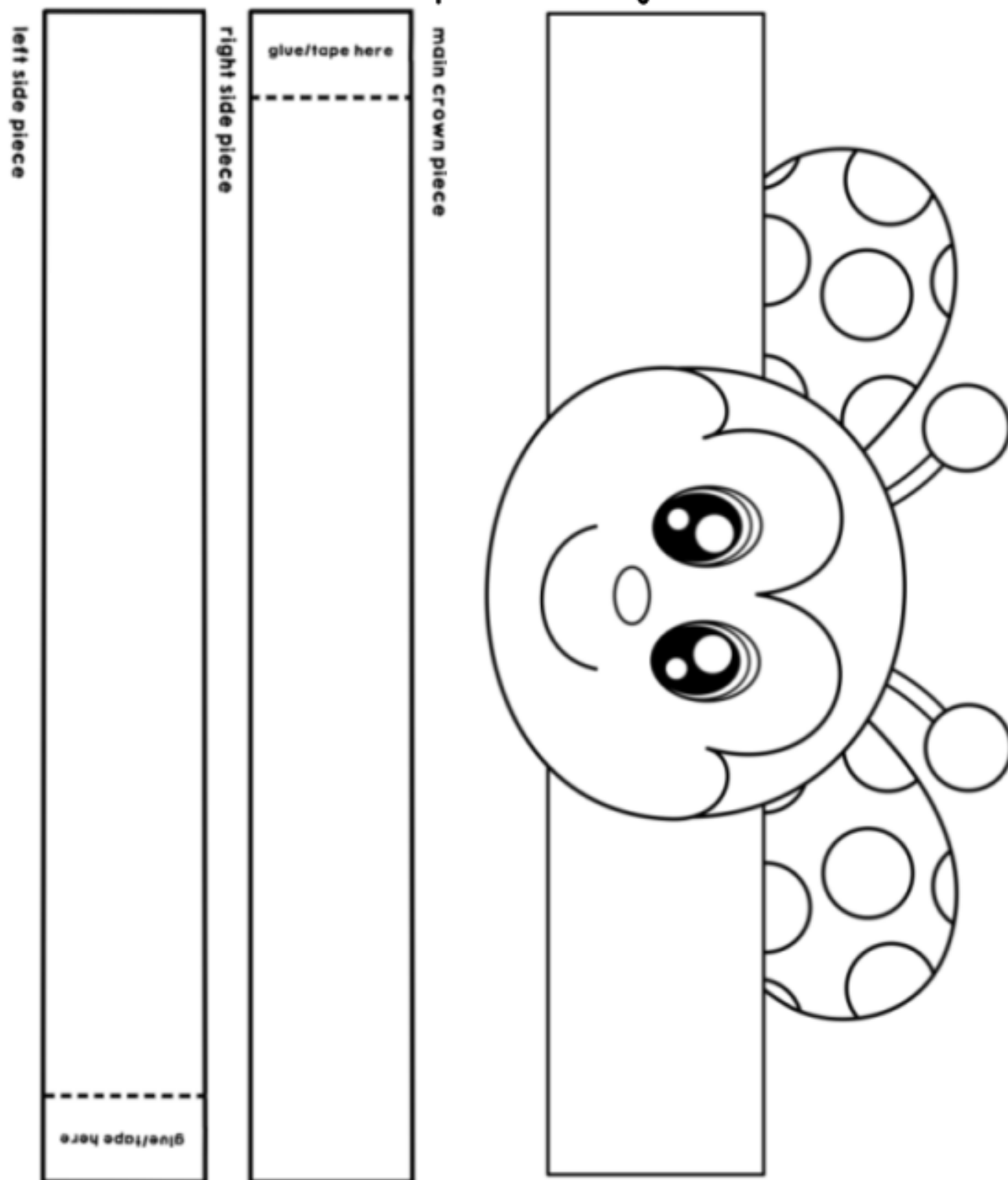
1. print crown on card-stock or standard paper

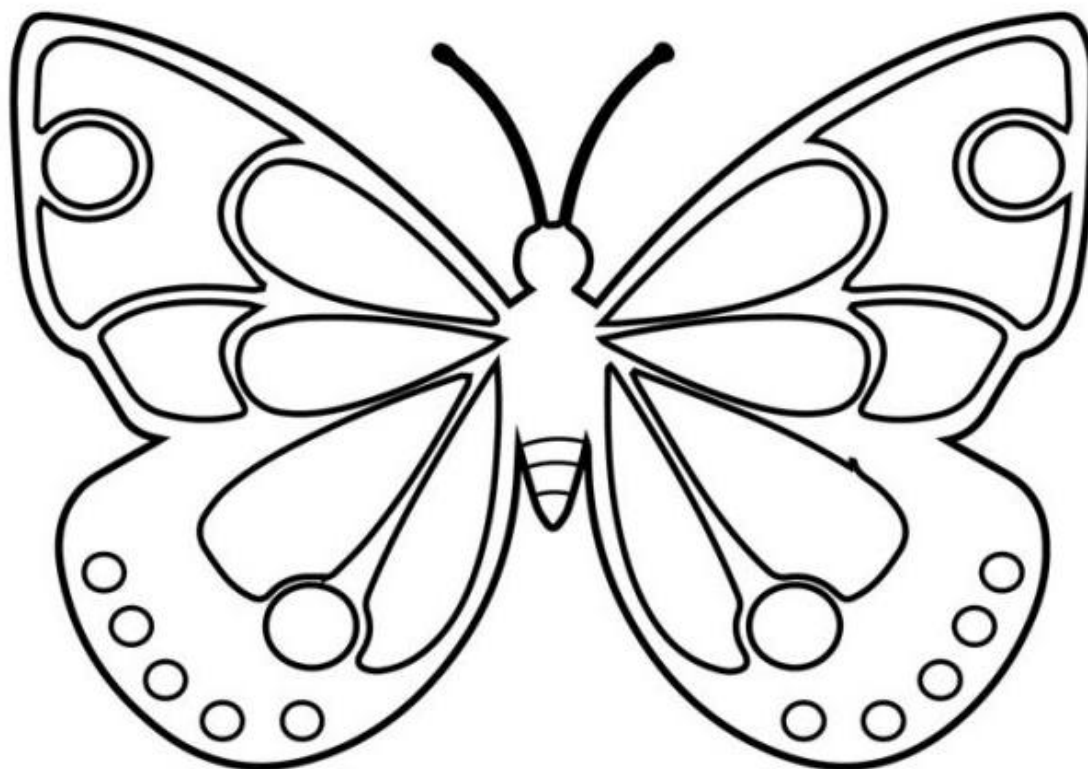
Lifecycle Spinners

Print on card, cut out and attach
through middle with a paper fastener



Make A Flapping Butterfly

Print on white card the template below, colour and cut out



On the scrap card that remains draw a rectangle 1-1/4 inches high and 4-1/2 inches long. Cut out the rectangle. Measure 3/4 inch from each of the short ends and mark with a pencil. Fold the cardstock on these marks. Then fold the cardstock in half in the other direction so the folded tabs face outwards.

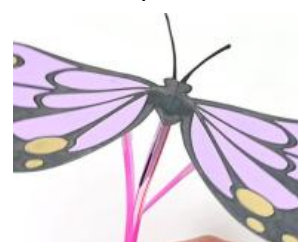
Fold the butterfly in half, and then unfold it again, setting the decorated side face down. Add glue to the tabs of the cardboard. Attach the tabs to the centre of the butterfly, lining up the crease in the butterfly with the tabs and fold.



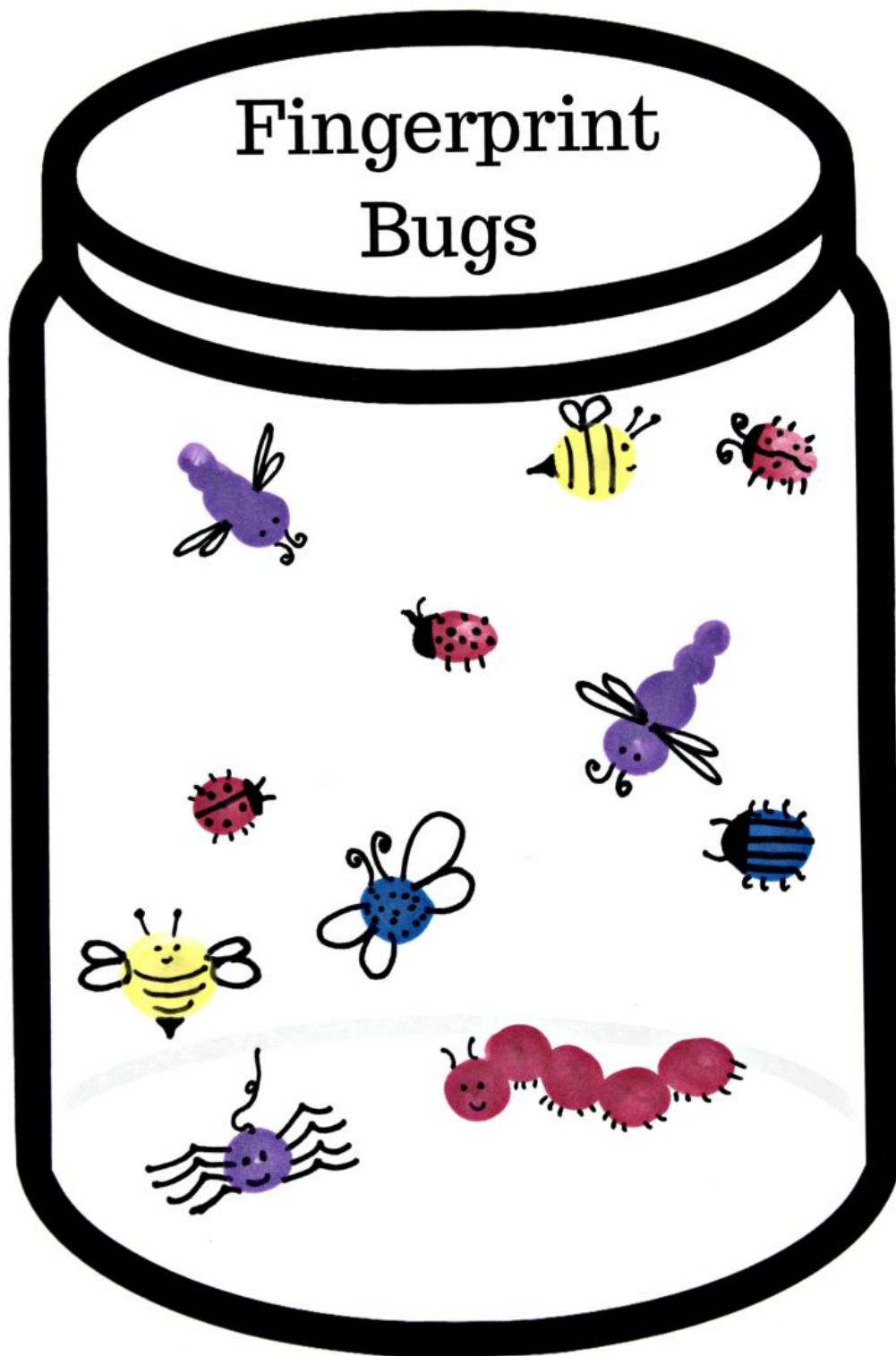
Take a 5mm diameter and a 6mm diameter straw. Cut off about 2 inches from the straw with the larger diameter (in our case, we cut off the entire bendy part of the straw) Cut a slit in the straw 2-1/2 inches long. Rotate the straw 180 degrees and make another slit the same length, directly across from the first slit. Cut a 2 inch slit in the smaller straw. Again, turn it 180 degrees, and make another 2 inch slit, directly across from the first slit. Open the two flaps in the smaller straw and slide it over the folded backing of the butterfly. Centre it and tape it in place on the cardstock. Slide the larger straw over the smaller straw. Again, separate the two flaps in the straw and push it up as far as it will go on the butterfly's wings. Take a 3 inch piece of tape and attach the flap of the larger straw to the wing so there's about 1-1/2 inches of tape on the wing and 1-1/2 inches of tape on the straw flap. Then take another piece of tape and wrap it tightly around the first piece of tape on the straw flap. Repeat on the 2nd wing. Unfold the butterfly and see how the straws control the

movement of the butterfly's wings.

Hold the longer (inside) straw with one hand and use your other hand to move the shorter (outside) straw up and down. Your flapping butterfly craft is complete

Make a Bugs Picture from Nature

Gather lots of seeds, pods, acorns, twigs, leaves, & acorns



Make a Firefly

You will need;

Coloured plastic eggs
Pipe cleaners
Sticky labels or Googly eyes
Battery tea-light
Silver Gaffer tape



Use a thumb tack to make holes to poke pipe cleaners through for antenna and legs. Draw eyes onto the labels and stick on or use Googly eyes. Make wings from gaffer tape, pop the tea-light inside and switch on. (We found a drill was easier to make the holes with)



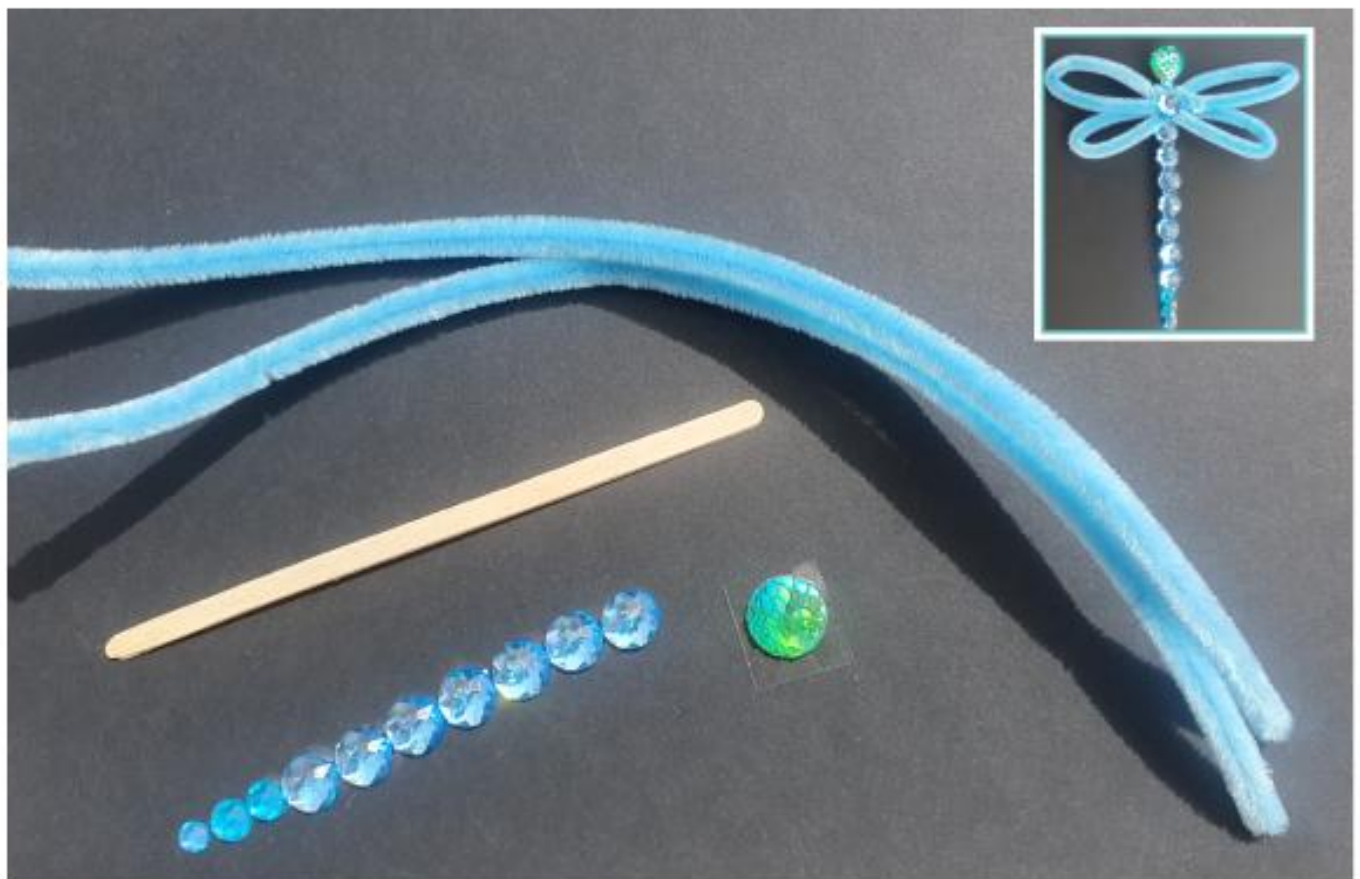
Gemstone Dragonfly

We wouldn't suggest this activity for Rainbows
Or even Brownies but Guides and Rangers should be fine

We used a coffee stirrer, 2 pipe cleaners and some
flat sided gems and a couple of googly eyes stickers.

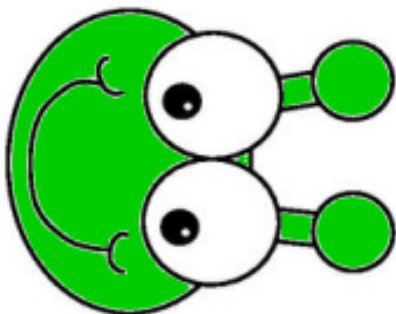
We attached the gems using a glue gun, for the wings
we used one large pipe cleaner made into a circle
and squashed it and then the smaller wings we cut
2 inches off and joined the ends to be a circle
and then squashed it and attached to the coffee stirrer.

We attached another gem on to the pipecleaners
to hide the joins and used a larger gemstone
for the head and attached the googly eye stickers.
We then added some self adhesive magnetic strip and put
him on the fridge door



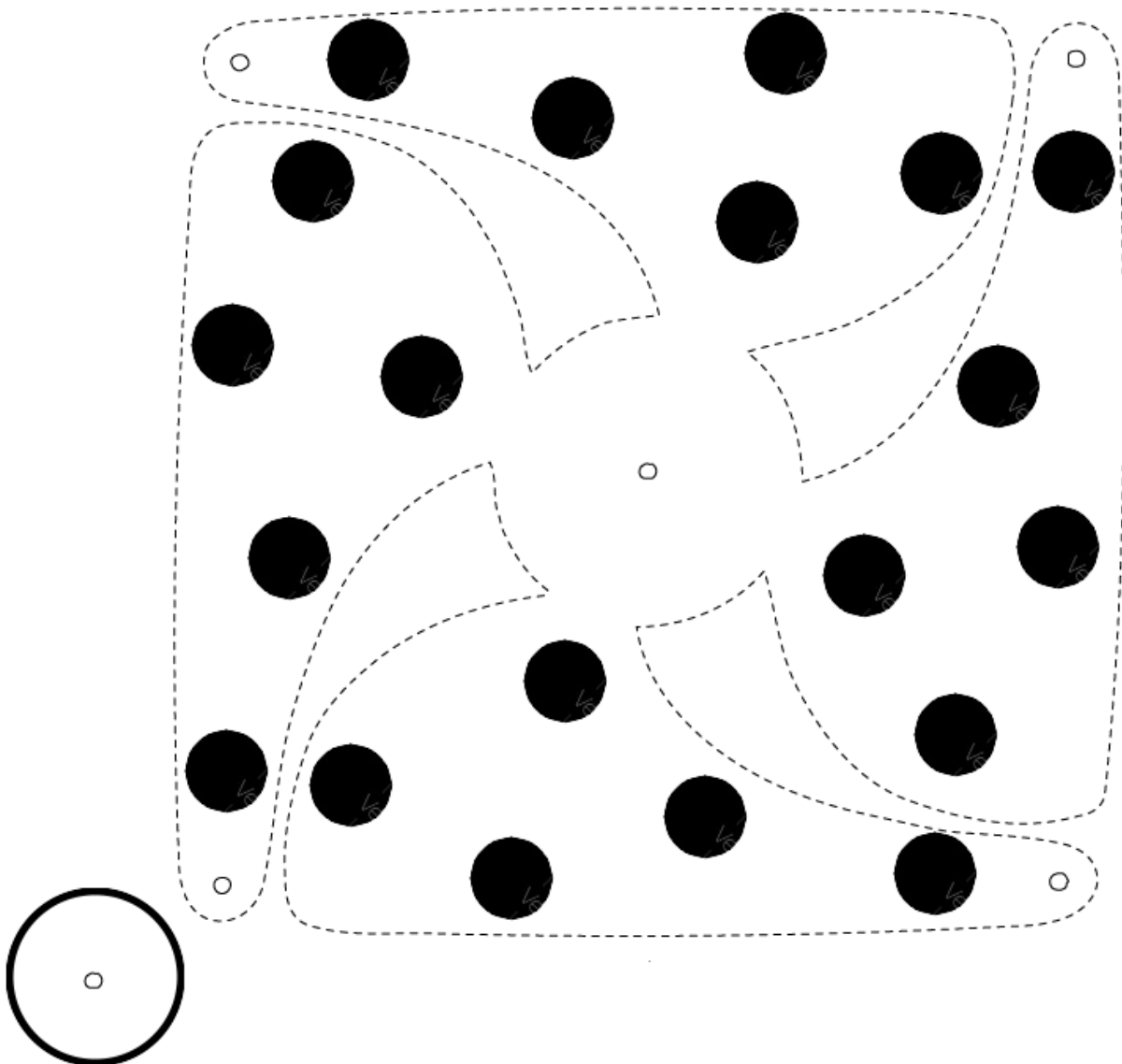
Moving Caterpillar

Print on card, using a craft knife cut along the horizontal lines and then around the out side of the whole. Join the two vertical strips marked A to each other. Colour in the face and glue to the front of the caterpillar. Use two skewers to make it move. .see video here <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PF-OqPdCBK0>



Ladybug Pin Wheel

Print the pinwheel below onto red card, cut out on the dotted lines and then fold the blades to the middle securing with a split pin, through the holes marked. Draw a face on the circle and attached to a wooden dowel or staw.

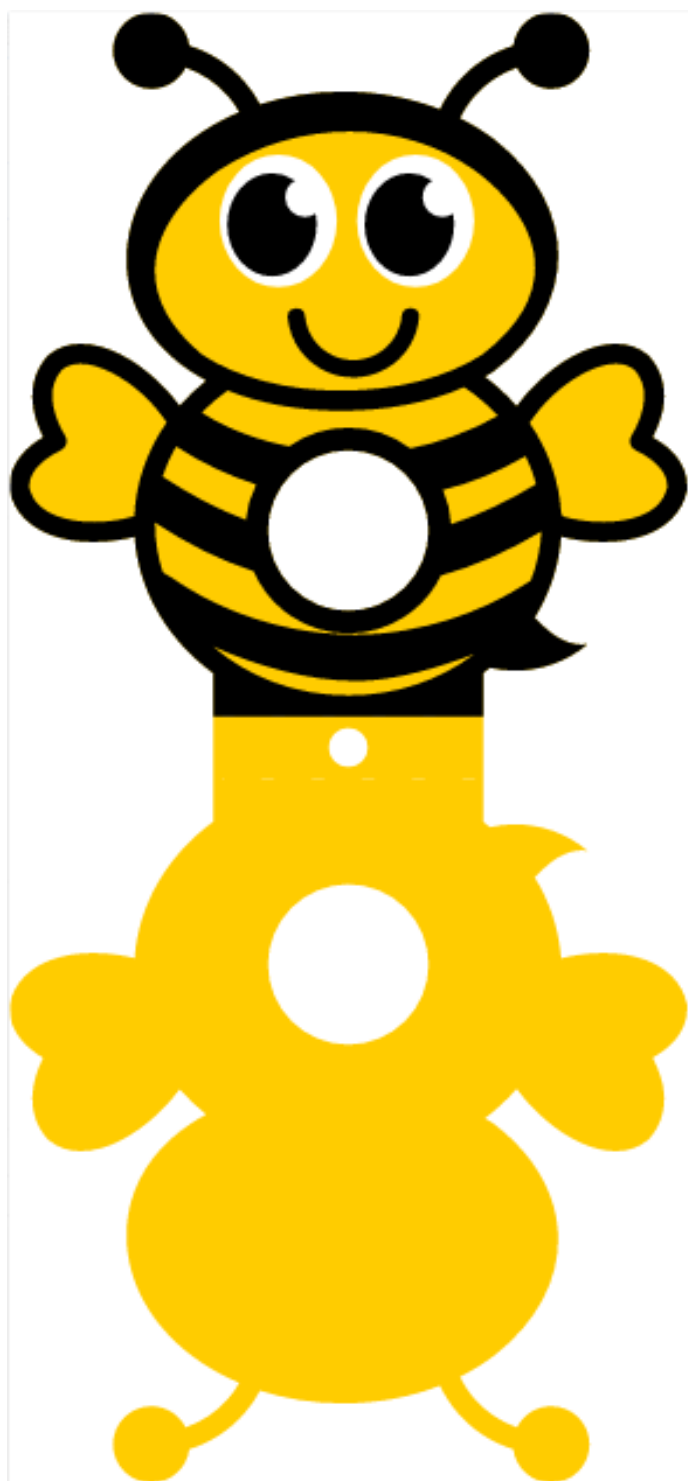
Draw a snail shape on card or paper and then decorate with coloured sticker shapes, you could use coloured stars or hearts

Make A Bee Lolly Pop Holder

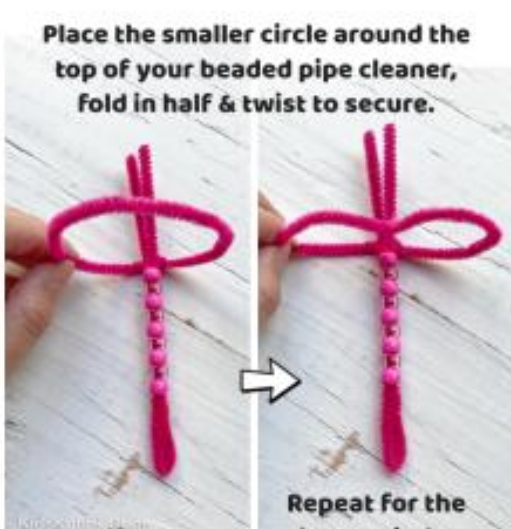


Print on white card,

Make a Ladybird Lolly Holder

Cut a red and a black circle of card the same size. Cut the red circle in two and then glue overlapping slightly so that there is a segment missing, as pictured.



Apply two googly eye stickers to the lolly. Decorate the red wings with black spots, we used black stickers but pens are an easy option. Glue the red wings to the black circle body, make two holes with a hole punch and thread the stick of the lolly through.



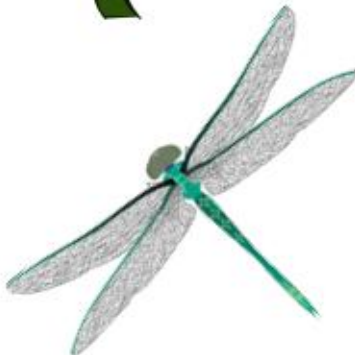

Grape caterpillars

You will need;

Green Grapes
Wooden Skewers
White Chocolate
Milk Chocolate
Piping Bags



Push your grapes onto the skewers. Melt the chocolate and put into piping bags. Use the white chocolate to make the eyes, let it set and then add a dot of milk chocolate to the eyes.

Honey Glazed Fruit Kebobs (Fruit Shop UMA)

Run a game where the girls can “buy” the ingredients. Thread bamboo skewers with black grapes and pineapple chunks alternately, then drizzle with runny honey for a tasty snack.



Make Butterfly Cakes

Bee Friendly Gardening (Take Action Skills Builder Growing Cups of Kindness)

Girls could grow a bee-friendly plant from seed to be given as a gift or plant a bee friendly flowerbed at your meeting place. Many bee friendly plants will attract other insects such as butterflies. Mint, thyme, rosemary, sage, sunflowers, lavender, lupins and hollyhocks are some bee friendly plants which can be grown from seed. Why not have a competition to see who can grow the tallest sunflower? Alternatively, visit someone who keeps bees or an insect friendly garden.



Cook a meal using butterfly pasta - Farfalle



Butterfly Charcuterie

Charcuteries have become very popular. While special plates can be bought, we made our own, using some thick cardboard cut to shape a butterfly shape and then covered with silver foil, we carefully made a lip to the edges of the butterfly to avoid spillage and then filled with fruit for our Rainbows.



Make an Oreo edible spider



Make Strawberry Ladybugs

You will need:

Strawberries,
Black Grapes
Dark Chocolate
White Chocolate

Cut the ends off the strawberries and cut them in half. Cut the grapes in half and stick to the cut end of the strawberries. Melt the chocolate and put into piping bags. Use the white chocolate to make the eyes and let it set. Use the dark chocolate to put a dot on the eyes and a stripe and dots on its back



Make Caterpillar Biscuits

Use a leaf cookie cutter to make some leaf shaped biscuits. Cover with some thick green butter icing and then decorate using smarties as pictured, a chocolate button for the head and candy eyes. We used smile slices of fruit strips for antennae but strawberry laces or some green angelica would work too.

Make Ladybird Biscuits.

Take a round biscuit and cover with red butter icing or red fondant icing. Use maltesers cut in half for the spots, a mini oreo biscuit for the head and candy eyes.



Looking for a healthy snack? Try the Baby bel cheese Ladybird.



Using a small round cutter, cut a semicircle from one side of the wax for the head, then remove the wax, leaving the cheese intact

Cut a sharp triangle from the wax, point side towards the semi-circle you just removed. This will form the wings.

Using the end of a drinking straw, cut dots from the wax and remove. Add two of the wax dots back onto the cheese in the head area to form the eyes. Pop the cheese ladybird on top a salad to decorate, then serve immediately. You could even use small flower cutters to cut flowers out of carrot & cucumber slices

Make a Banana, honey and yoghurt smoothie

(Serves 1)

Ingredients:

½ banana

Natural yoghurt

Orange juice

Honey

Lemon juice

Place half a banana, 100ml of yoghurt and 50ml of orange juice in a blender with 1tsp of honey and a splash of lemon juice and blend.

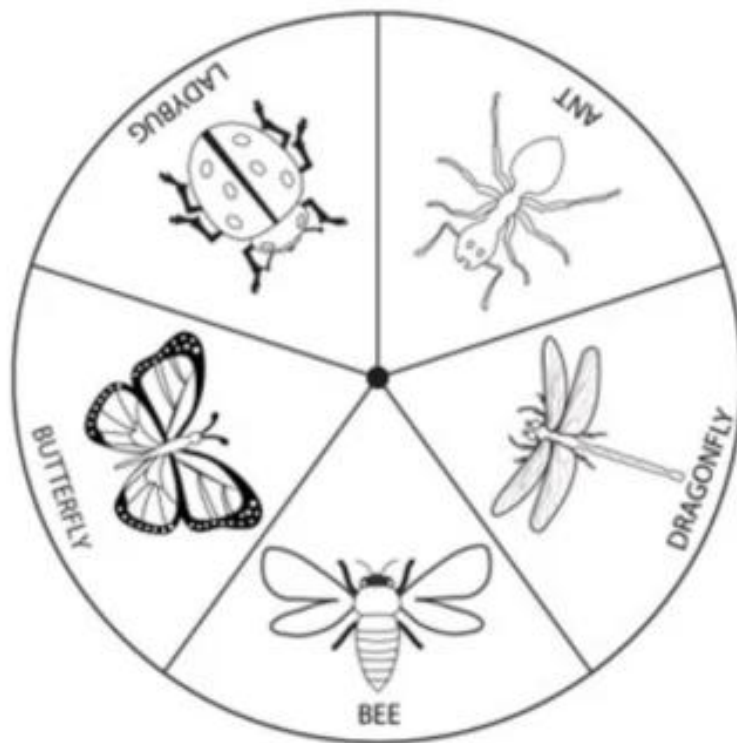

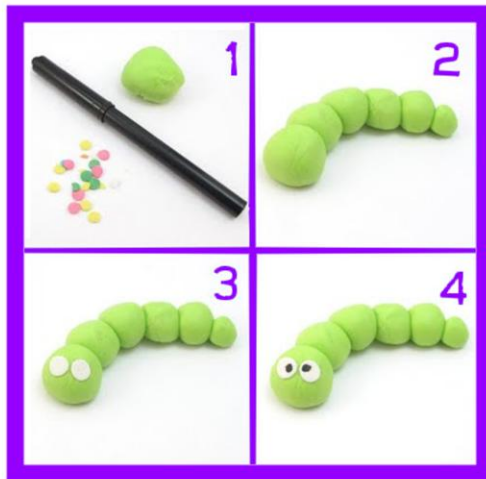

(Discuss how many of each body part a bee has before you start and where they join together)

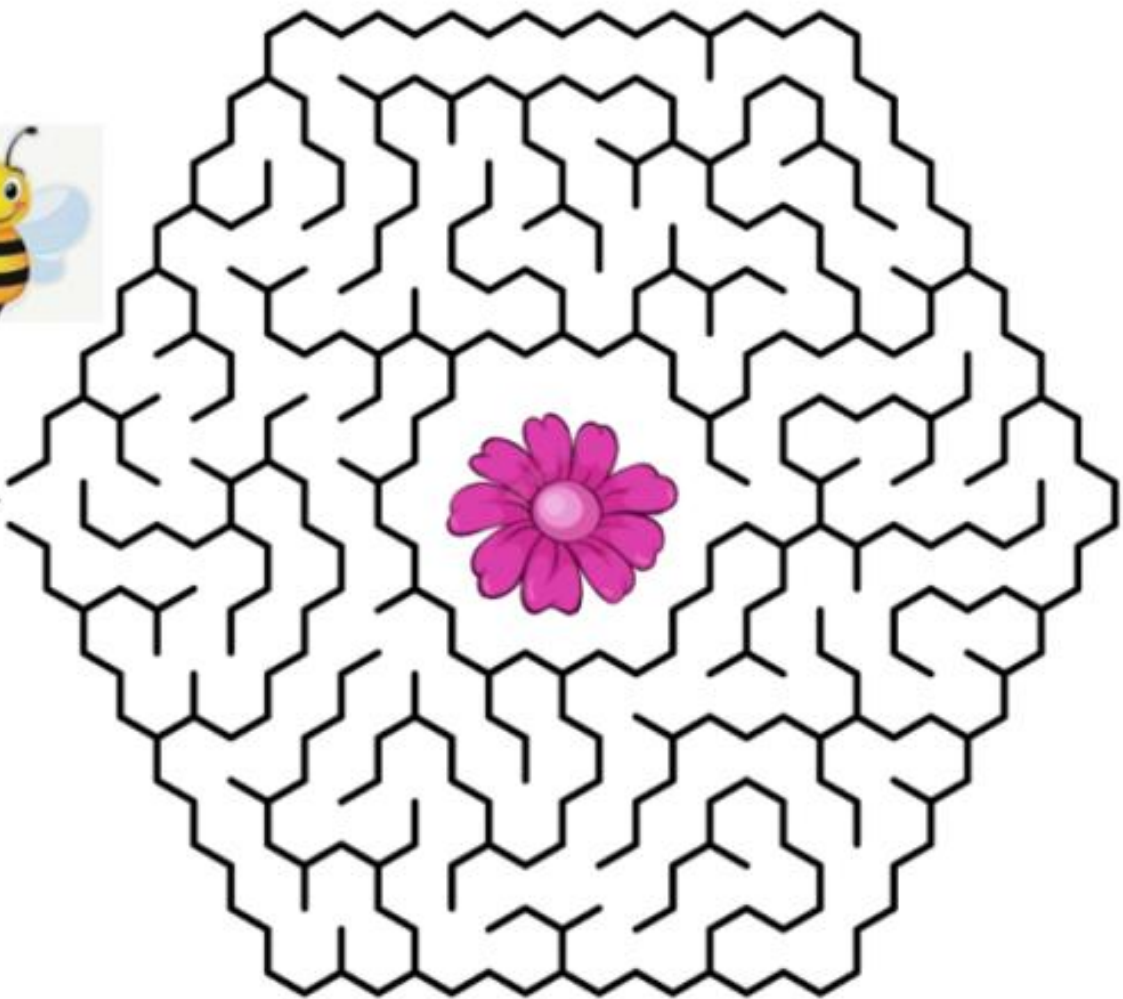

The Spot It Bugs Game

Spot It Bugs consists of 30 cards, each showing 6 symbols.
Between any 2 cards there is always 1 - and only 1 - matching symbol.

You will need to print each disc on card and then we suggest laminating each card so that they can be used again.

To play as a Relay game.

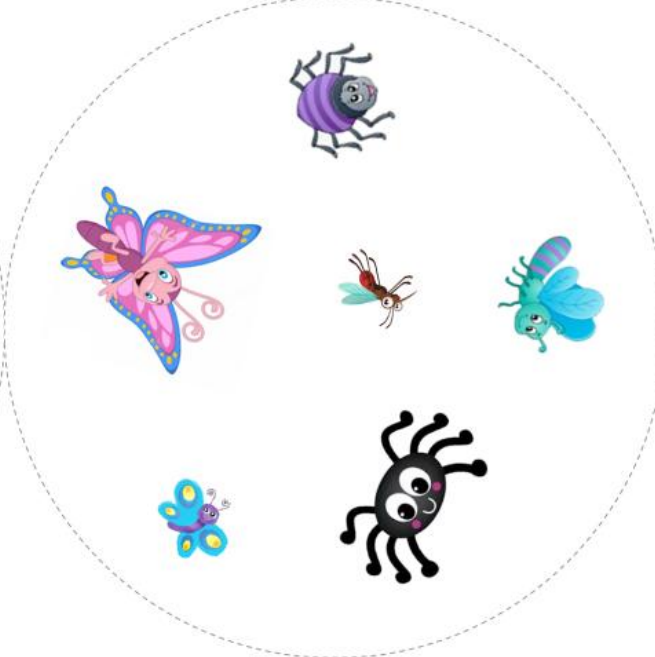
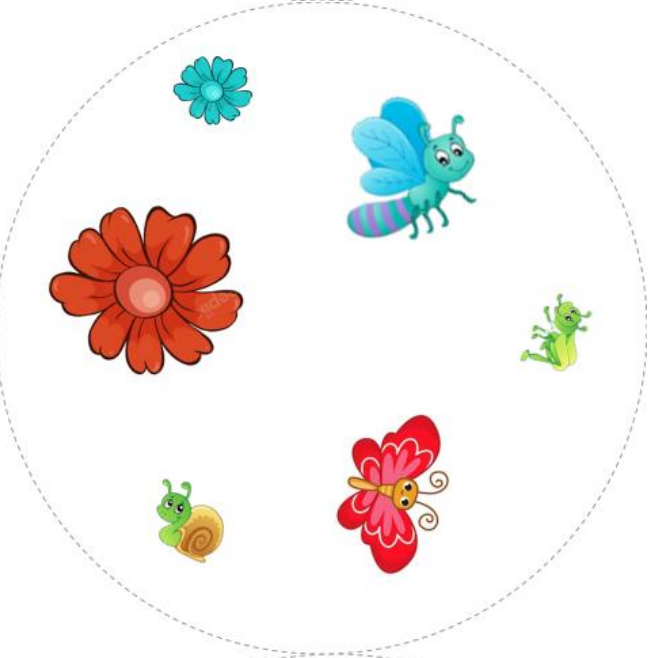
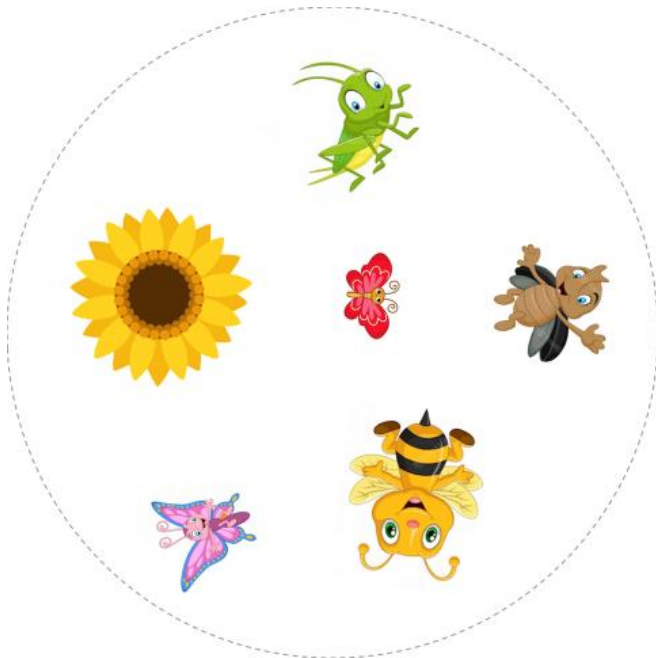
Divide girls into teams. Each team will need a leader at the opposite side of the play area.

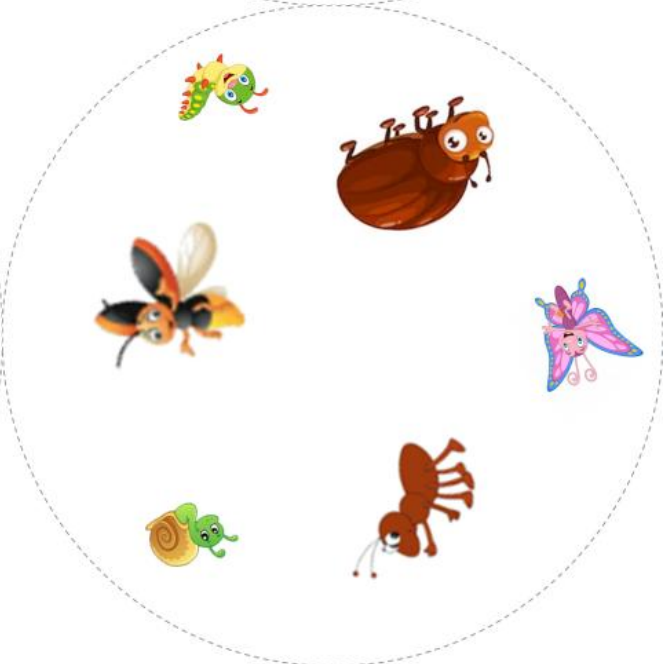
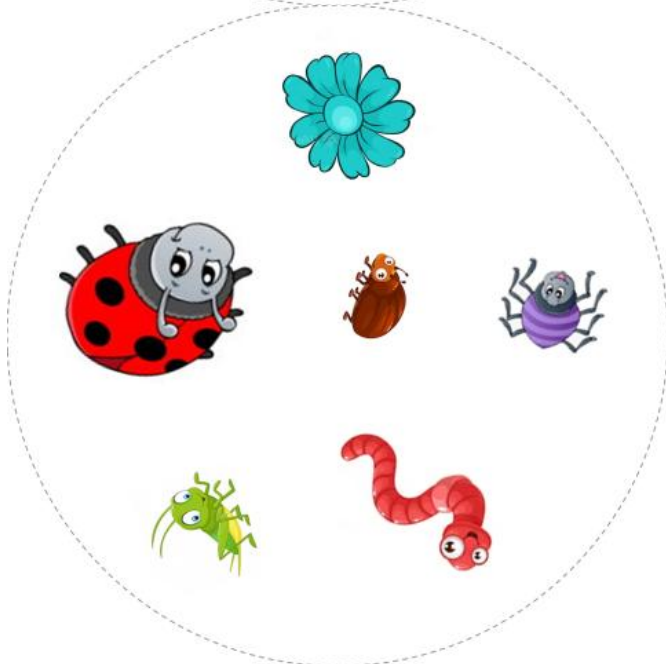
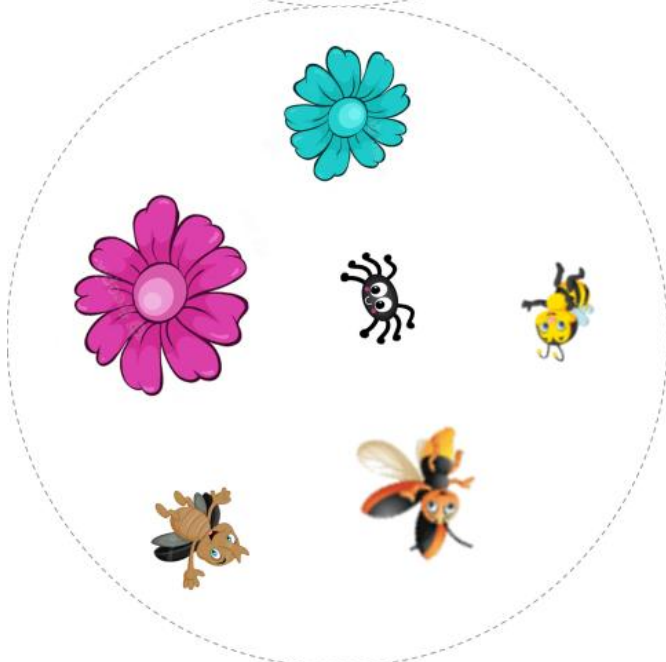
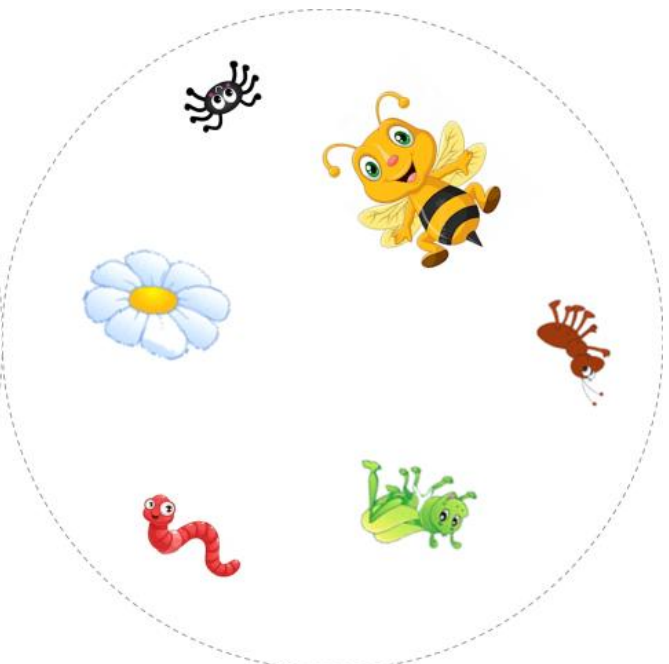
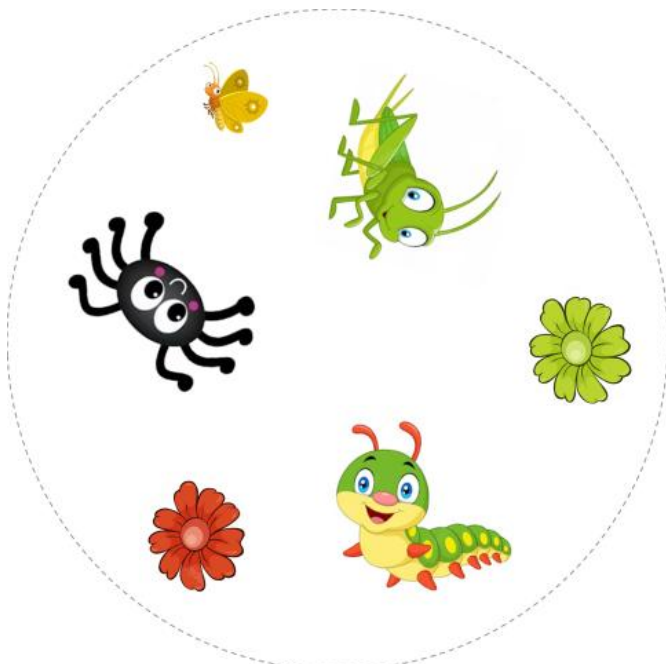
Give each leader one of the cards. Teams will stand at the other side of the play area and each girl will also have a card. Girl one runs to the leader and compares her card with the leaders, she has to spot the matching symbol. Once she has she runs back to her team and girl 2 runs up to find her matching symbol. First team with all their cards matched is the winner.

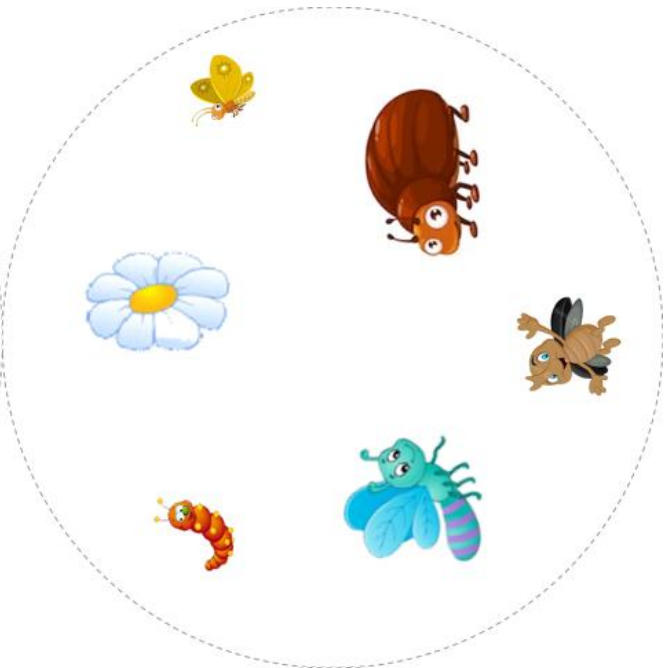
To play as a Tower game (3-6 players)

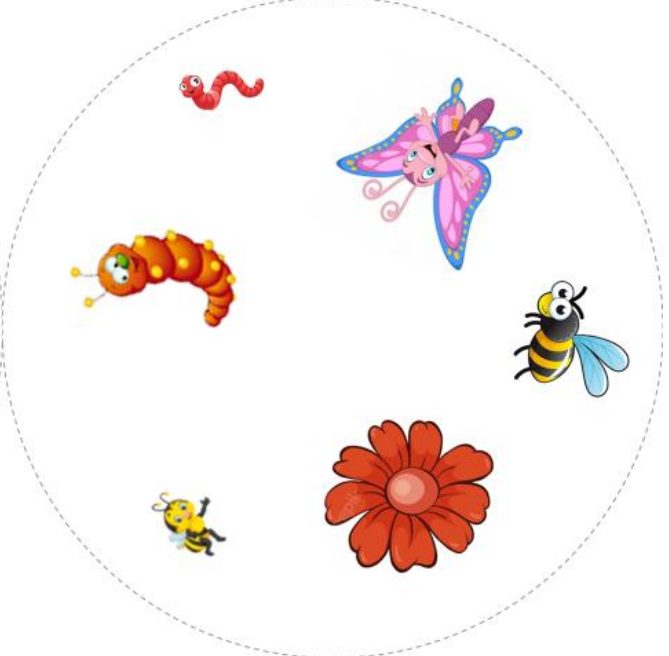
Deal 1 card to each player face down. Place the remaining cards face up in the middle of the table. Object of the game is to collect the most cards.

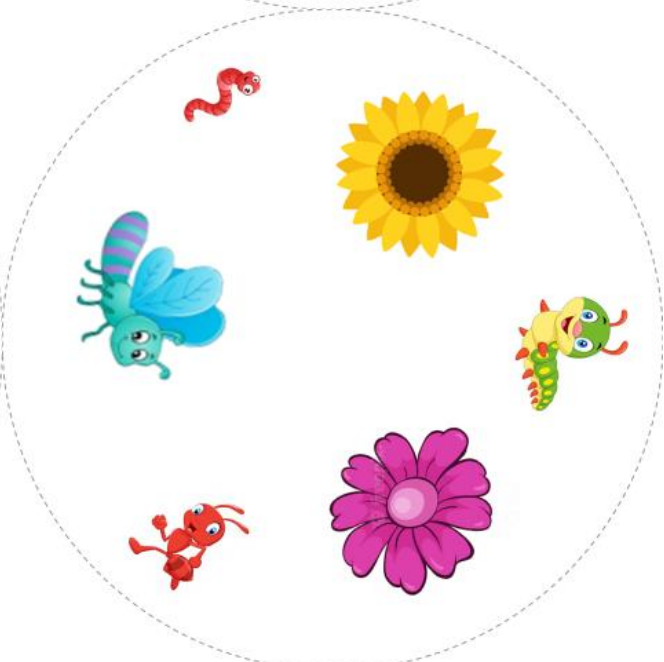
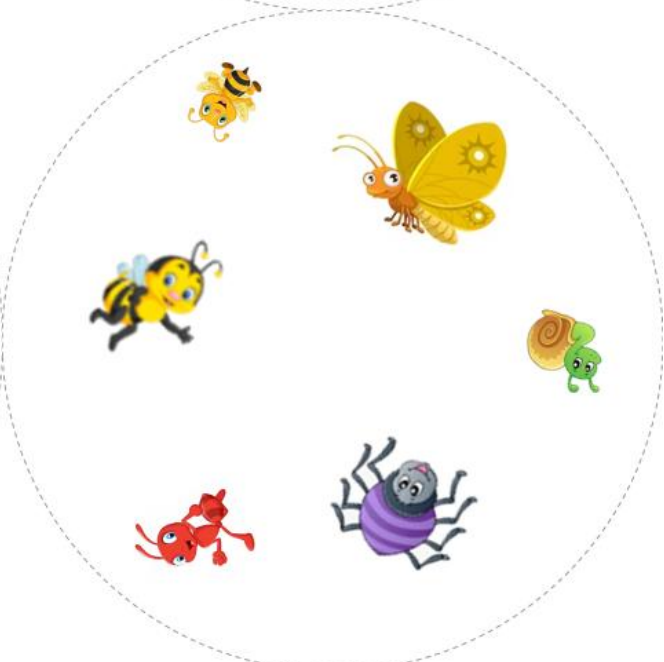
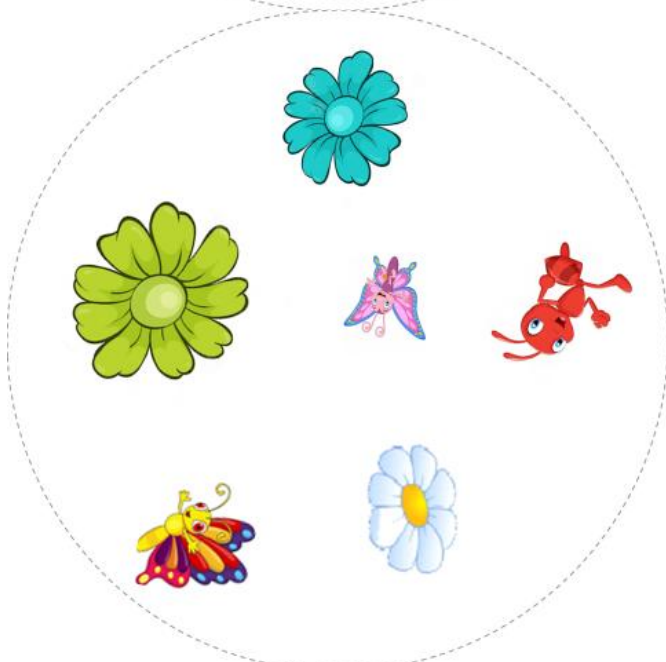
Simultaneously players flip their cards face up and try to spot the 1 symbol that appears on both the centre card and their own card. As soon as a player finds their match, they call it out. Then they take the top centre card and place it face up on top of their card to form a personal pile. Now they use the new top card on their personal pile to find a match with the new centre card. Continue playing until the centre pile runs out of cards. The player with the most cards wins.



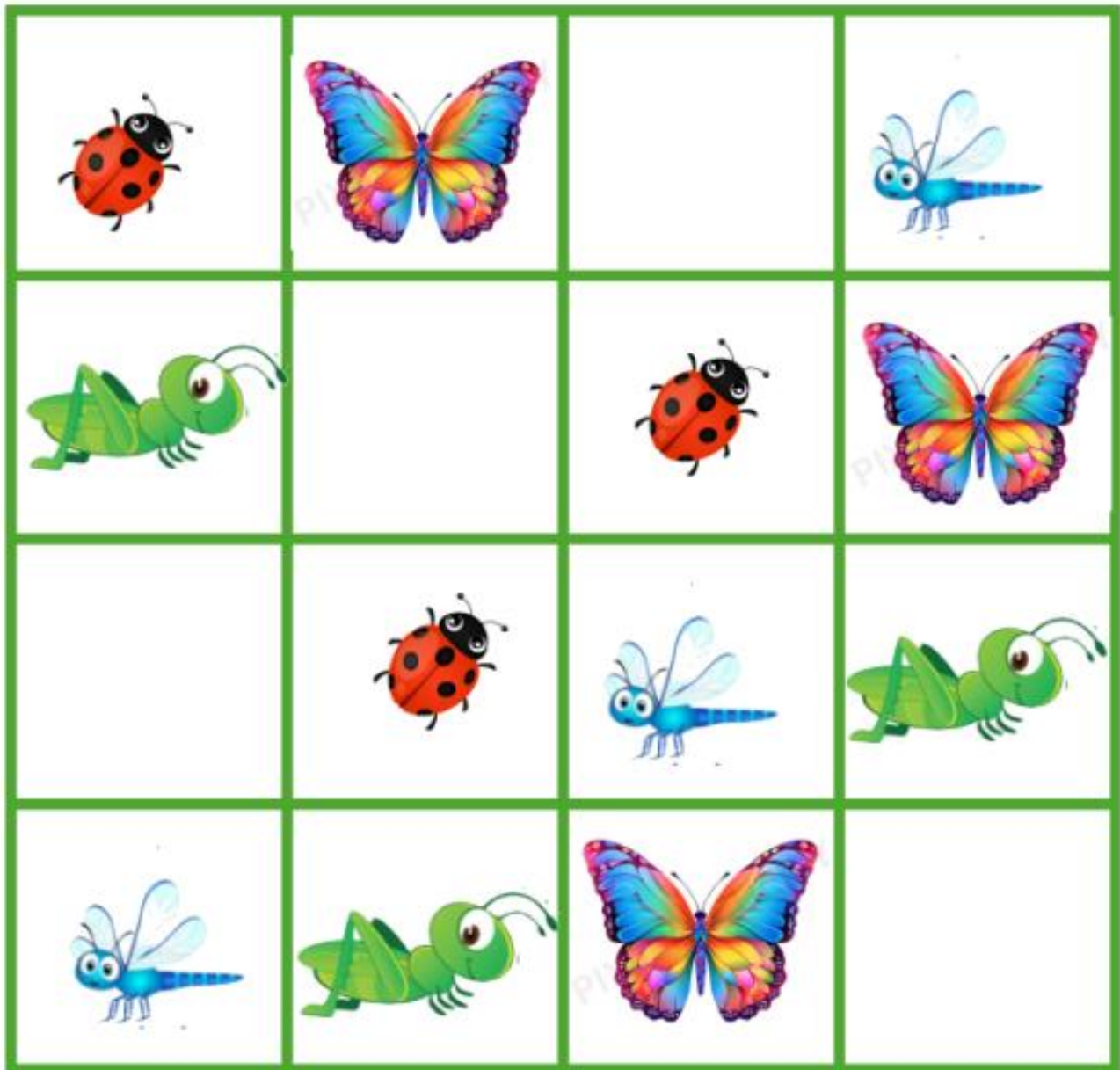






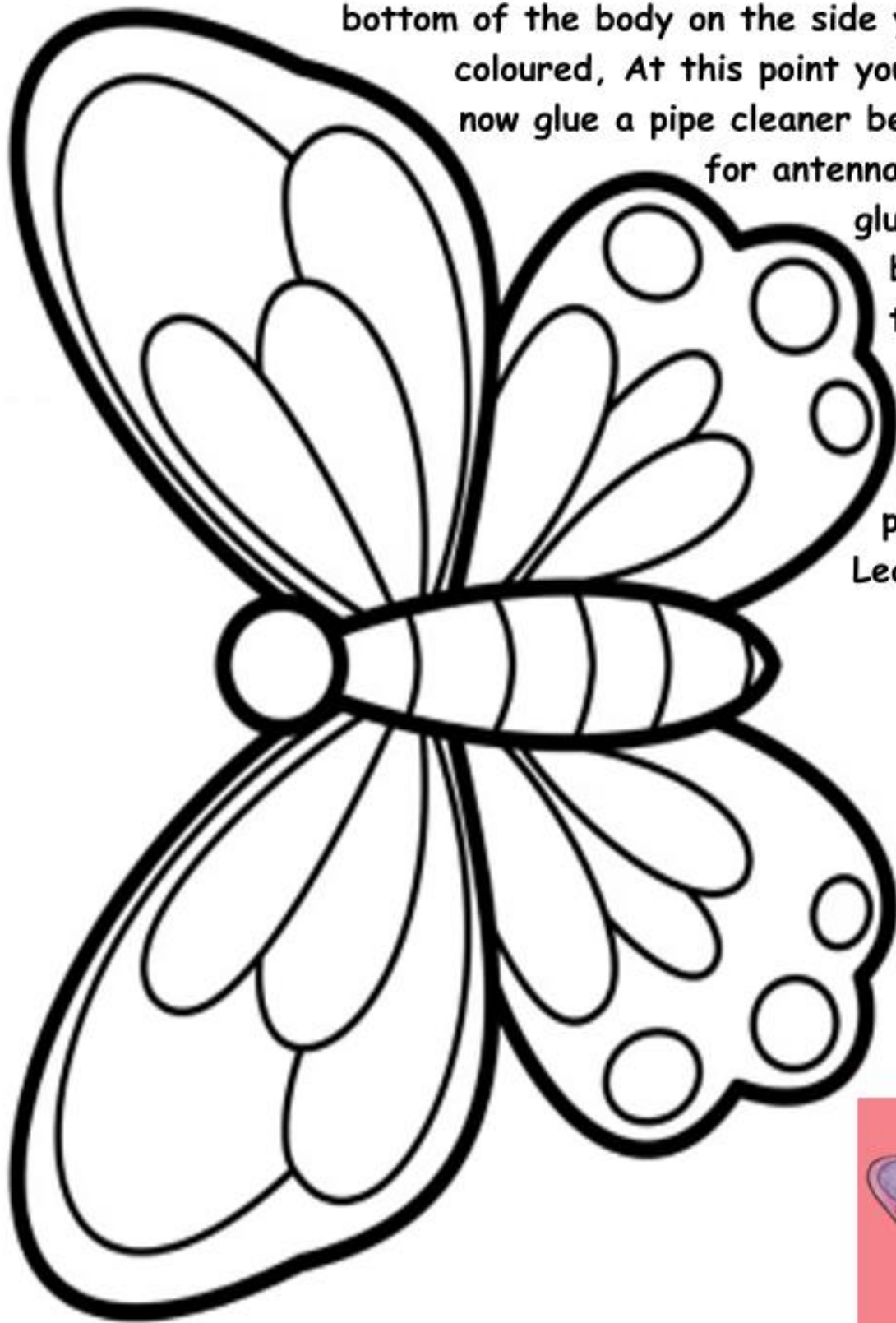
