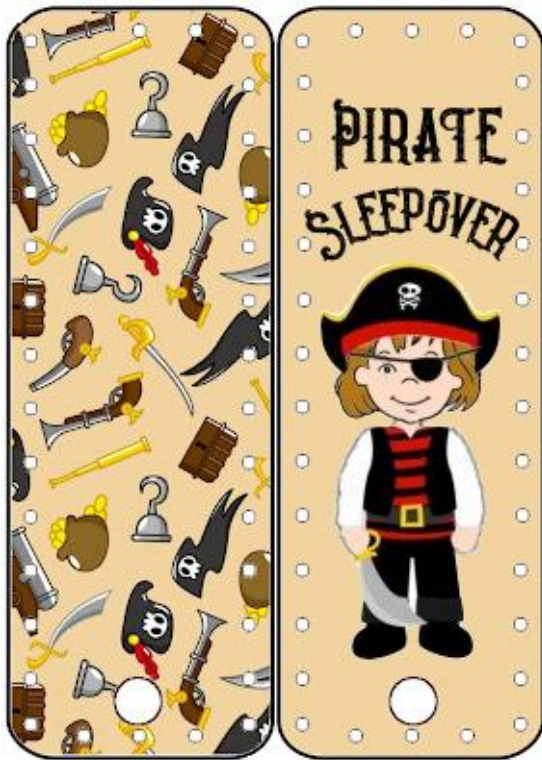

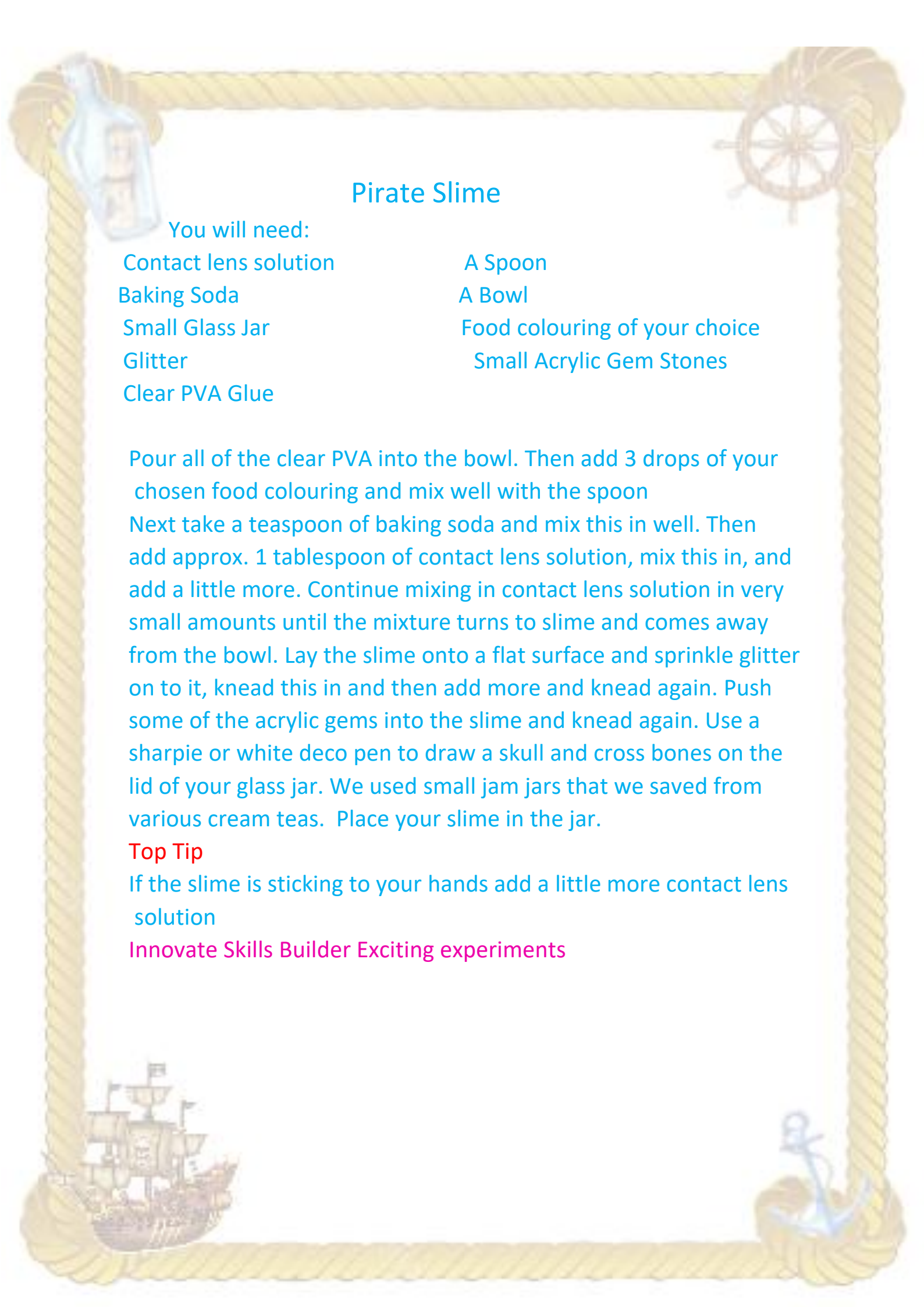


Print and cut out the bookmark

Pirate Slime

You will need:

Contact lens solution

Baking Soda

Small Glass Jar

Glitter

Clear PVA Glue

A Spoon

A Bowl

Food colouring of your choice

Small Acrylic Gem Stones

Pour all of the clear PVA into the bowl. Then add 3 drops of your chosen food colouring and mix well with the spoon

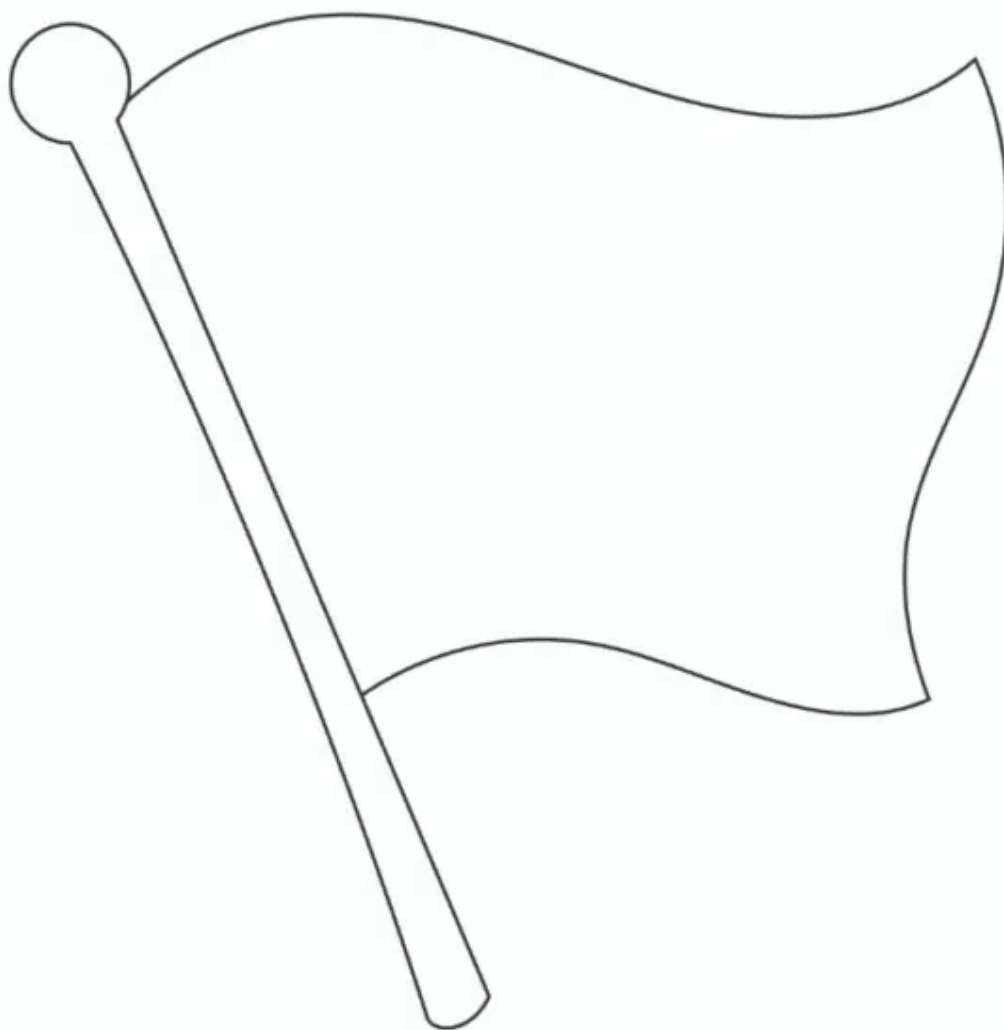
Next take a teaspoon of baking soda and mix this in well. Then add approx. 1 tablespoon of contact lens solution, mix this in, and add a little more. Continue mixing in contact lens solution in very small amounts until the mixture turns to slime and comes away from the bowl. Lay the slime onto a flat surface and sprinkle glitter on to it, knead this in and then add more and knead again. Push some of the acrylic gems into the slime and knead again. Use a sharpie or white deco pen to draw a skull and cross bones on the lid of your glass jar. We used small jam jars that we saved from various cream teas. Place your slime in the jar.

Top Tip

If the slime is sticking to your hands add a little more contact lens solution

Pirate Story Stones

You will need one pebble for each participant. These pebbles are available to buy from either Hobbycraft or Baker Ross. (You could even make your own, just get a pebble mold and plaster of paris). Please do not remove pebbles from the beach. We used acrylic paint pens to draw on various Pirate related items. Smaller details we drew on later with a black sharpie pen. Make sure the paint is really dry before doing this.

To use, ask your girls to select a stone each and then start taking turns to each add your bit of the story that involves whats depicted on your stone.

Pirate Lolly Holder

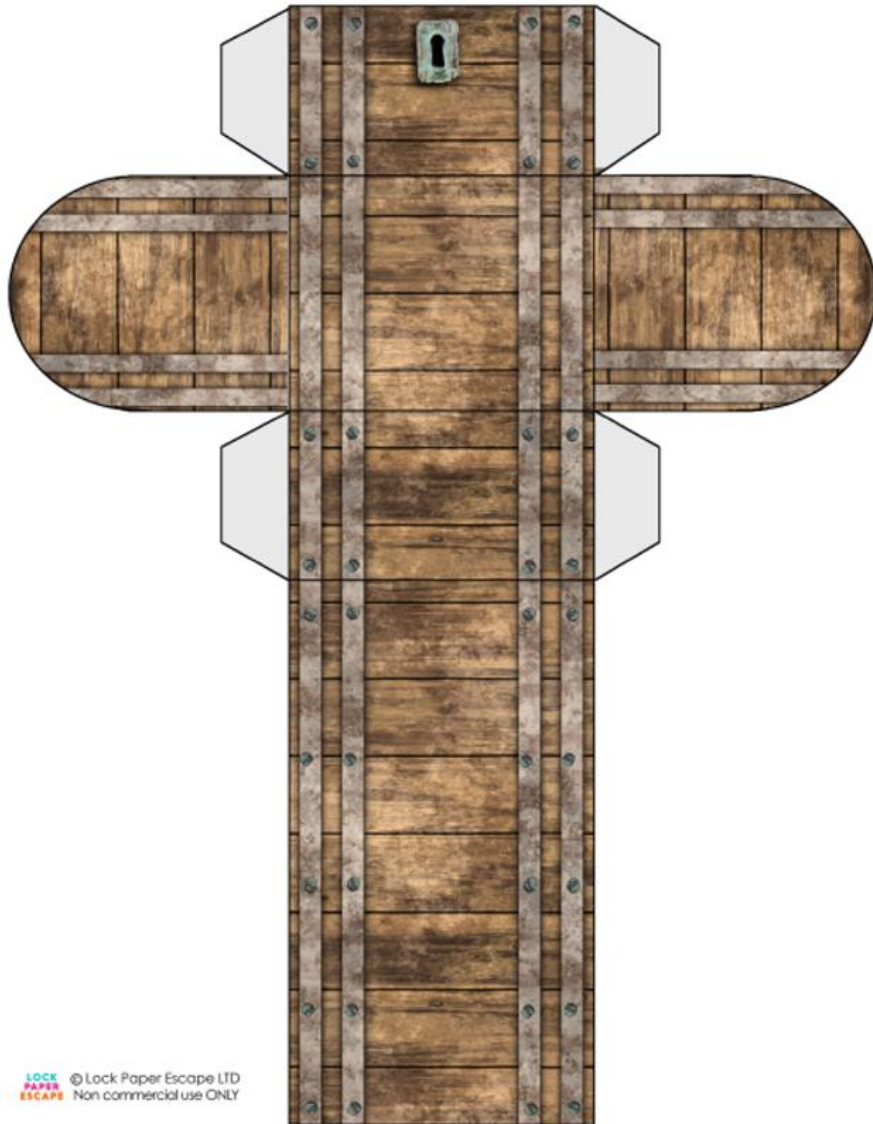

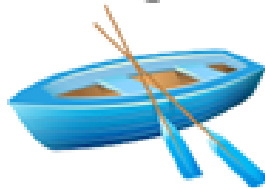

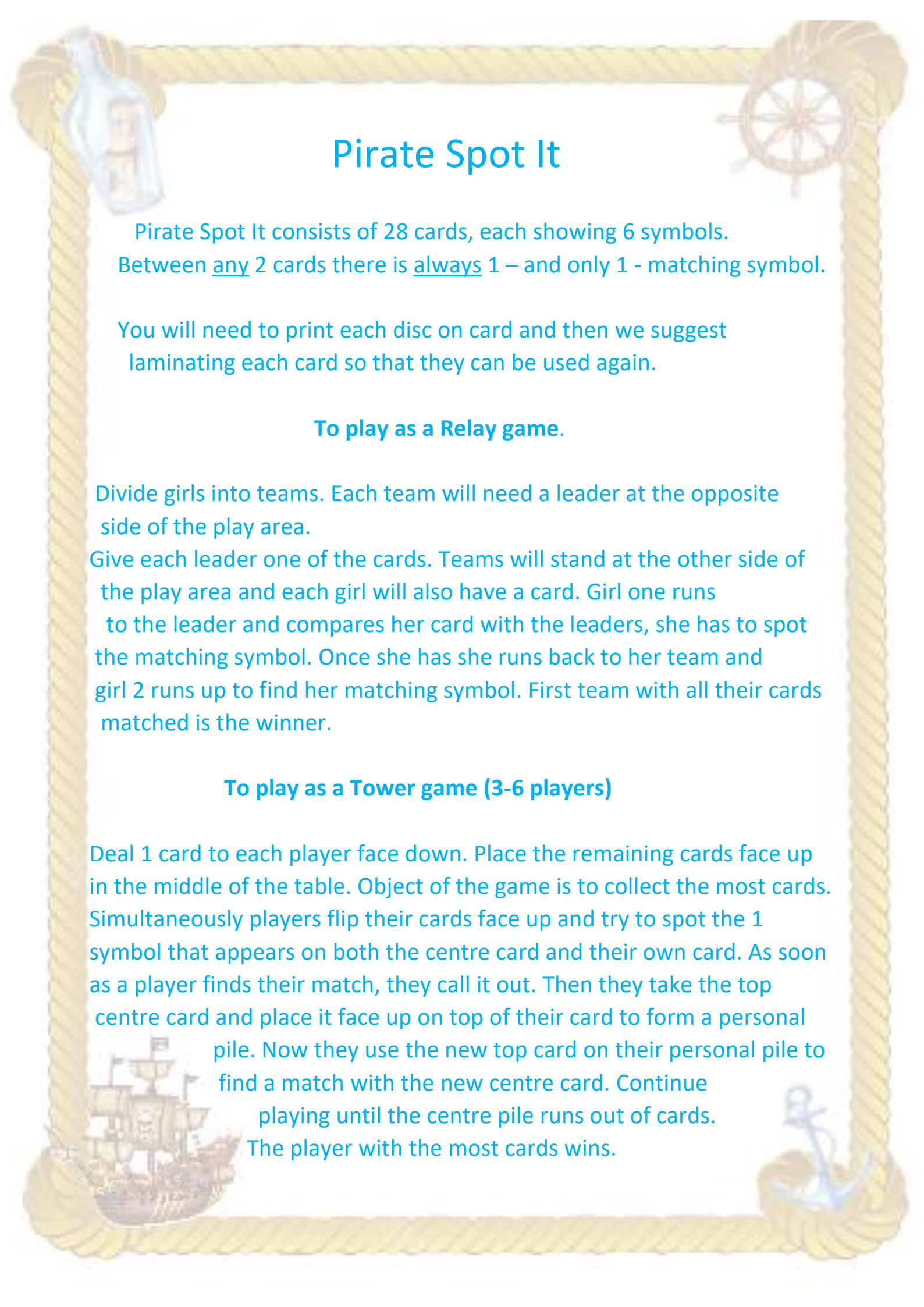

Leader stands an equal distance away from the groups and calls out 1 card at a time. Groups then send one girl from their group to collect card, first girl gets the card. See which group can get all the cards and shout Pirate Bingo first



Pirate Spot It

Pirate Spot It consists of 28 cards, each showing 6 symbols.
Between any 2 cards there is always 1 – and only 1 - matching symbol.

You will need to print each disc on card and then we suggest laminating each card so that they can be used again.

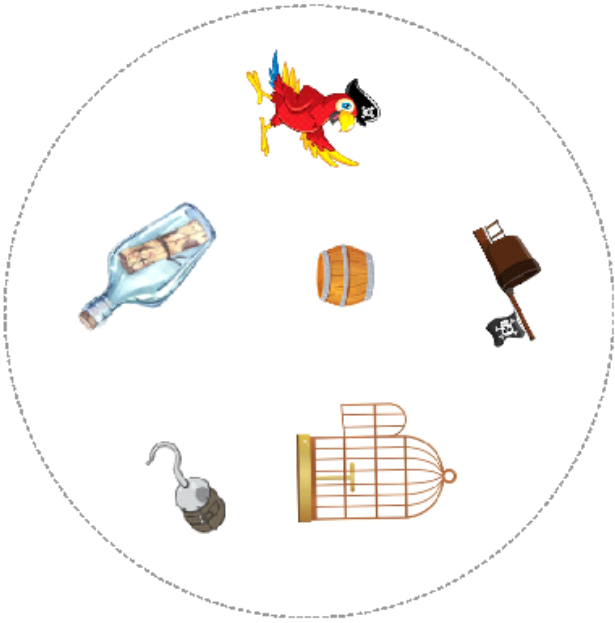
To play as a Relay game.

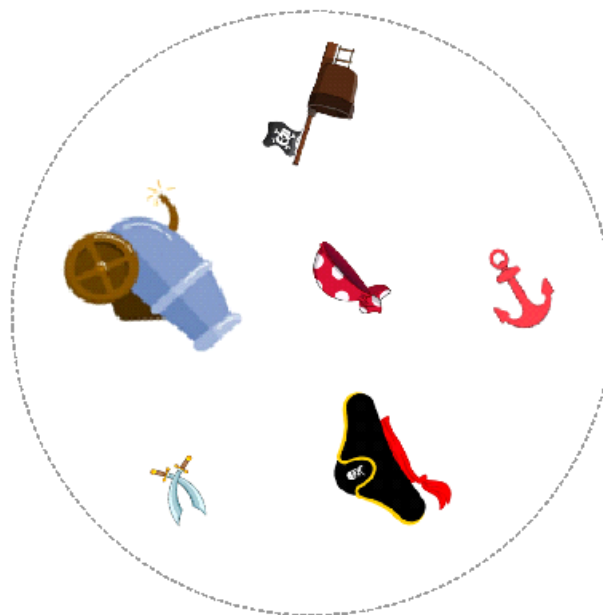
Divide girls into teams. Each team will need a leader at the opposite side of the play area.

Give each leader one of the cards. Teams will stand at the other side of the play area and each girl will also have a card. Girl one runs to the leader and compares her card with the leaders, she has to spot the matching symbol. Once she has she runs back to her team and girl 2 runs up to find her matching symbol. First team with all their cards matched is the winner.

To play as a Tower game (3-6 players)

Deal 1 card to each player face down. Place the remaining cards face up in the middle of the table. Object of the game is to collect the most cards. Simultaneously players flip their cards face up and try to spot the 1 symbol that appears on both the centre card and their own card. As soon as a player finds their match, they call it out. Then they take the top centre card and place it face up on top of their card to form a personal pile. Now they use the new top card on their personal pile to find a match with the new centre card. Continue playing until the centre pile runs out of cards. The player with the most cards wins.

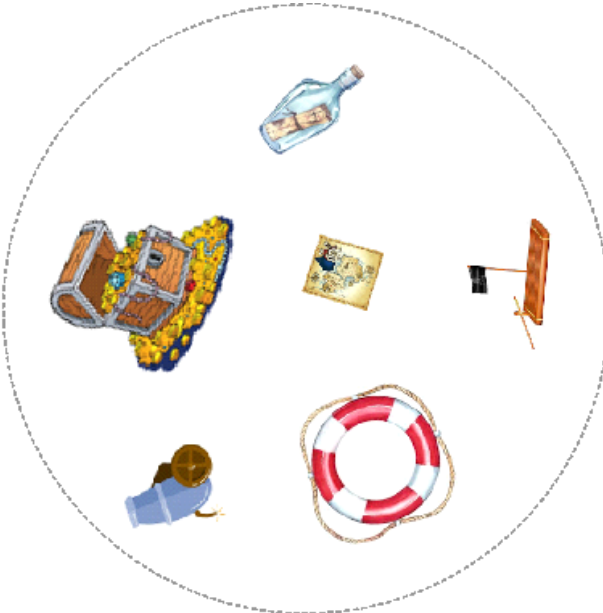










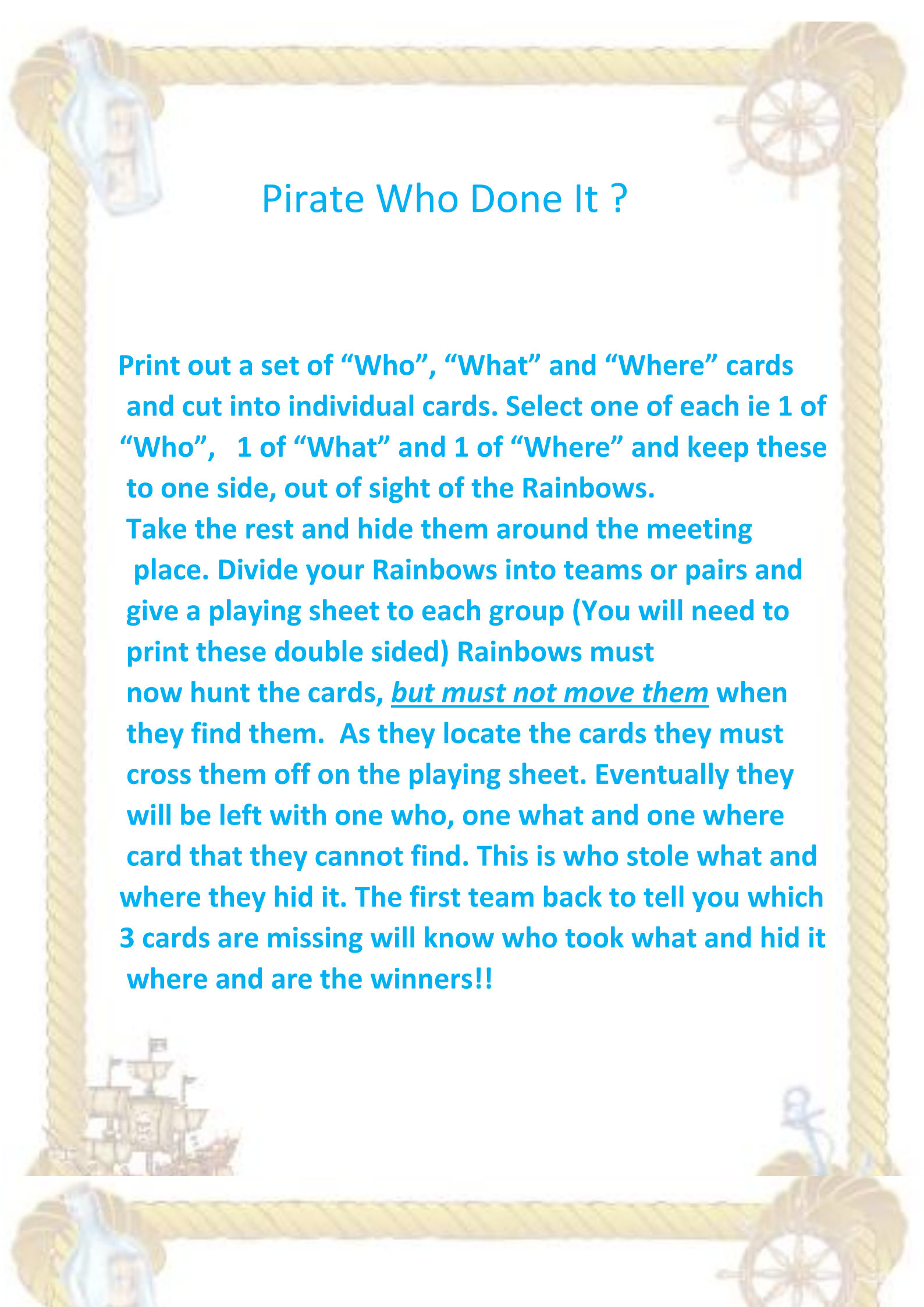




Pirate Relay Game

We purchased two 2nd hand Pirate Jigsaw Puzzles, both identical and used them for a relay game, the girls took turns to collect the pieces and used teamwork to put the pieces together. The ones we found were originally from M&S and even have lift up flaps with very corny Pirate Jokes.





Pirate Who Done It ?

Print out a set of “Who”, “What” and “Where” cards and cut into individual cards. Select one of each ie 1 of “Who”, 1 of “What” and 1 of “Where” and keep these to one side, out of sight of the Rainbows.

Take the rest and hide them around the meeting place. Divide your Rainbows into teams or pairs and give a playing sheet to each group (You will need to print these double sided) Rainbows must now hunt the cards, but must not move them when they find them. As they locate the cards they must cross them off on the playing sheet. Eventually they will be left with one who, one what and one where card that they cannot find. This is who stole what and where they hid it. The first team back to tell you which 3 cards are missing will know who took what and hid it where and are the winners!!

We hope you like our clues, but just in case you would prefer to write your own we have included a blank one for you to use, we used font Berkshire Swash which's available on the internet to download for free.

Our treasure was packets of Gold Chocolate Coins. Pretty much available all year around but you can get pirate design ones. If you prefer to buy them cheaply straight after Christmas the next page has some printable stickers you could use to make them more "Piratey"!



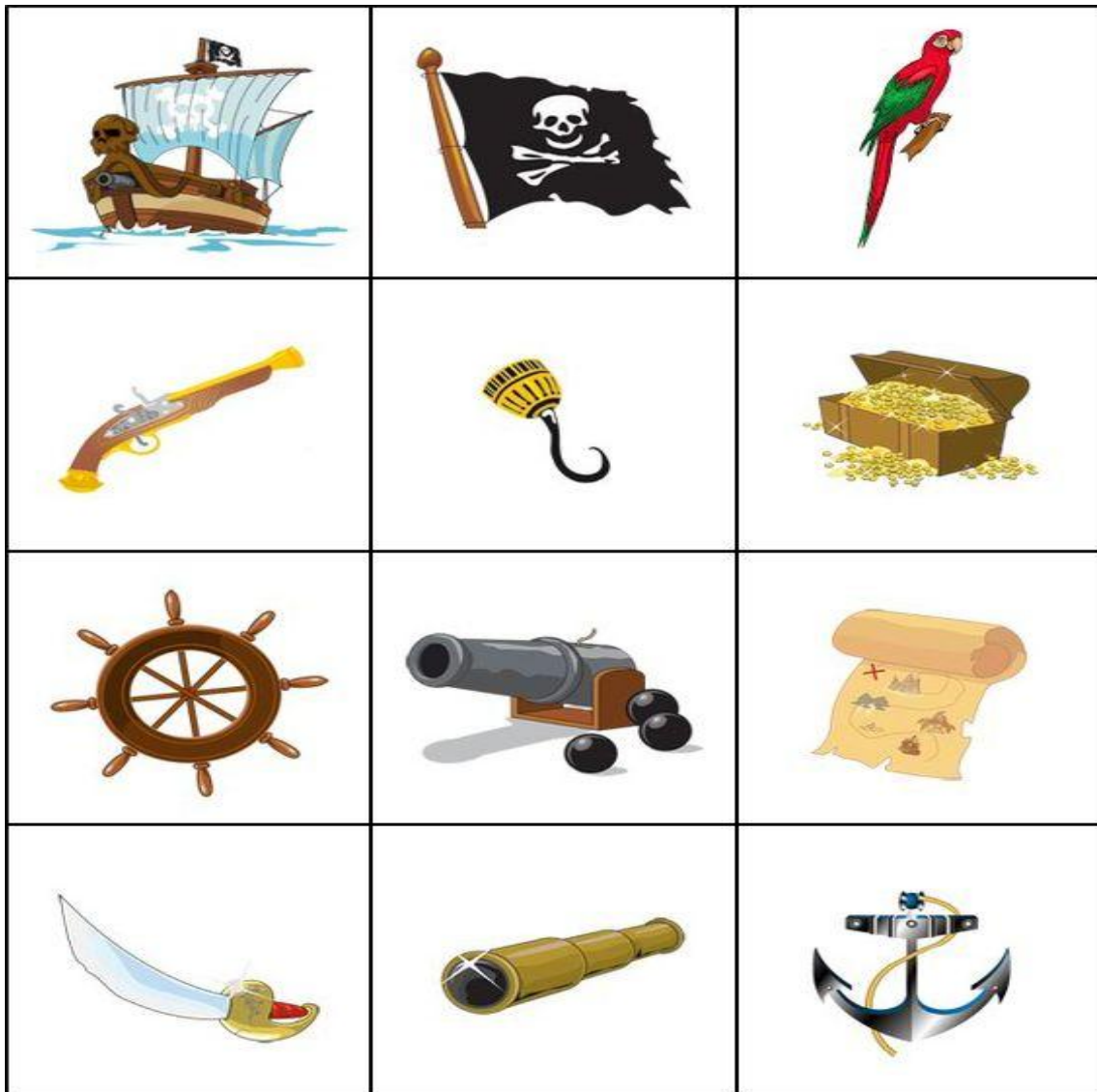


We put our Chocolate Coins in cellophane bags and then used these bag toppers (just fold in half and place either side of the top of the bag and staple into position). We then put them in a wooden treasure chest we got cheaply on Facebook Market Place.



Pirate Kim's Game

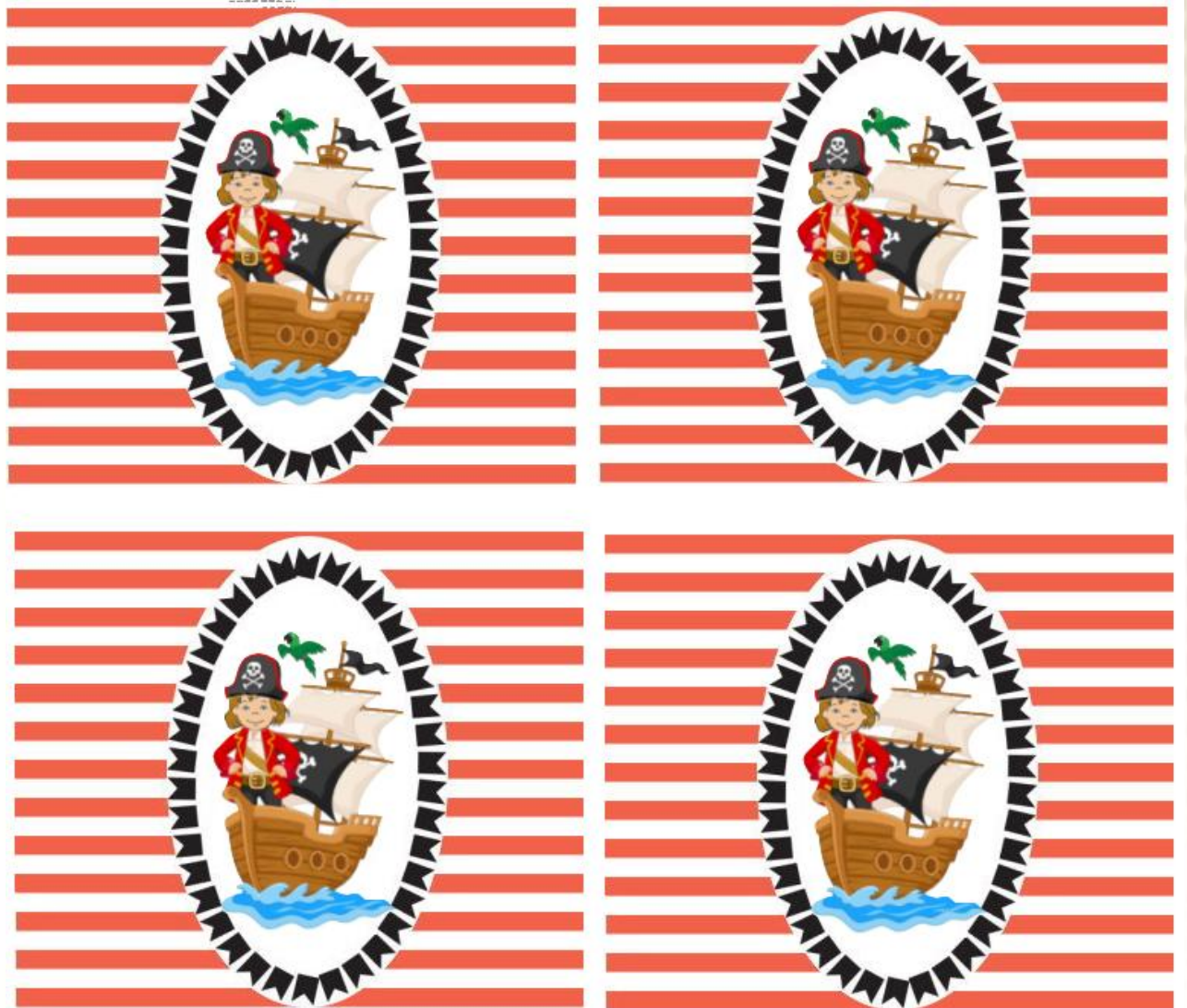
Print and cut out the cards and lay out in front of the girls.

Pirate Cookies

There are dozens of great cookie cutters available on the net ... this is our favourite, bought on Amazon and our recipe below.



Ingredients

227g unsalted butter, softened

60g icing sugar

250g plain flour

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°F Line 2 baking trays with baking paper
2. In a large bowl cream together the butter and icing sugar
3. Add in the flour and mix until just combined. If your dough feels sticky pop it in the fridge for 30 minutes to chill.
4. Dust your rolling pin and work surface with icing sugar and roll out the dough to $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thick.
5. Cut out the cookies, re rolling the scraps as necessary
6. Bake for 10-12 minutes until the edges are gently browned. Let the cookies cool completely before icing.

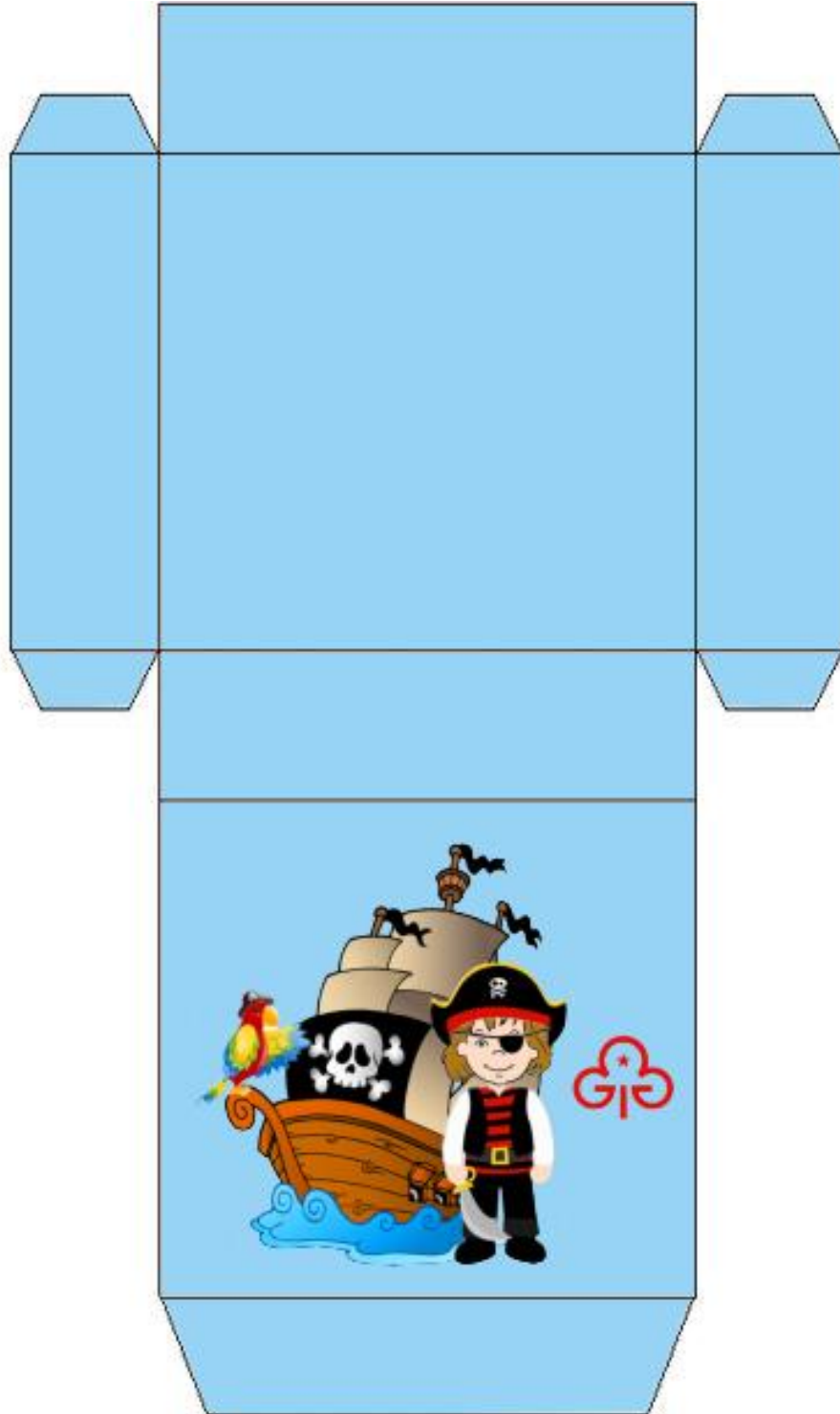
Gold Coin Oreos
