Where an activity fits all or part of a Skills Builder, Interest Badge or UMA we have indicated this.

LET'S RAINBOW CHAT!

Here are some ideas which you could use in Rainbow Chat/Circle time to discuss road safety & its importance

- Talk about potential dangers on the roads e.g. level crossings, ice cream vans, parked cars. Cars & other vehicles need to be able to see you; if you can't see them, they can't see you **Skills Builder Skills for my future safety superheroes.**
- Talk about the situations when you might see an ambulance or fire engine on the road & what you should do. You need to look out for them as even on a road crossing, they don't have to stop as they are in a hurry
- If you are having a traffic light themed evening, talk about the colours of the traffic lights & what they mean. Red=stop, Green=go. ALWAYS wait until you see the green man at a crossing BEFORE you start to cross
- Play recordings of road noises (ambulance, car, pedestrian crossing, etc.) Give cards to the rainbows either with a picture of the vehicle on them or the name of the vehicle. Can the Rainbows hold up the right card to match the noise? Explain that the Rainbows MUST listen out for noises on the roads as they can warn them that traffic is coming. Cards in the resource section. MP3 of the noises to match the cards is available on our website www.BlagdonRainbows.co.uk
- Talk about when you would call the emergency services if you saw an accident on the road

- Discuss how vehicles with wheels go faster because of their wheels. Wheels are fast & traffic can go really fast - much faster than the fastest person can run. A car might look a long way away but it can get to you fast and hit you hard
- Talk about the different people who can help us. Maybe you could invite one of them to visit your meeting and give a little talk about keeping safe whilst out & about: **Who Can Help Take Action UMA**
 - Lollipop Man / Lady
 - Policeman / Policewoman
 - Teacher
 - Mummy / Daddy
 - Babysitter
 - Rainbow Leader
- Get into small groups and give each group a large sheet of paper. Ask the girls to draw their local area (or leaders can do this part in advance). Can the girls mark safe crossing points such as zebra crossings, pelican crossings, where the lollipop men / ladies stand on the map? **This activity can be adapted to suit Skills Builder Explore, Explore Local**
- Conduct the Egg Experiment with the girls (details in the resources section)

LET'S GET CRAFTY!

- Collect some junk objects & in small groups, make traffic lights, a pelican crossing, a zebra crossing, a lollipop, etc
- Make a collage of a hedgehog (sadly they sometimes get squished in the road ☹) **This is me hedgehog Skills Builder Feel Well**
- Find out when road safety week is & make a poster advertising it
- Make animal masks of the different road crossings; puffin, zebra or pelican
- Make toilet roll puffins, zebras or pelicans
- Draw a poster about what you would do if you become lost or separated from your parents whilst out
- Design an outfit to help someone be easily seen when walking near roads at night
- Draw a poster of people on pavements holding hands & vehicles on the road. Discuss how holding hands keeps you safe
- Paint an ambulance in its bright colours. Why is it painted so brightly? So people can see it coming if it's travelling fast. Discuss how the ambulance could be carrying someone to hospital who has been hurt on the road. You can help make sure this isn't you by staying away from the road.
- Make a milk carton Traffic Light https://www.dltk-kids.com/safety/milk_carton_traffic_light.htm

LET'S GET FOODIE!

- Make traffic light biscuits
- Make traffic light sandwiches
- Make a traffic light smoothie
- Make traffic light jelly
- Make traffic light fruit kebabs This could be used as part of the Skills for my future Fruit Shop UMA
- Decorate Cupcakes as traffic lights, you could use smartie or fruit pastels for the lights.
- Pizza Traffic Lights

Use pizza dough to make strips of dough about 6" X 2" and about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick. Give each girl 2 strips. Cut 3 round circles out of one slice and lay it over the 1st. Fill the top circles with tomato slices or a tomato bolognaise style sauce, fill the middle circle with grated cheese or sweetcorn and fill the bottom hole with shredded spinach or a slice of courgette. Cook in the oven until dough is golden brown

LET'S GO OUTSIDE!

- Walk along the pavement & spot hazards in walking along it:
 - Cars reversing off drives
 - Cars parked on the pavement
 - Parked cars
 - Walking near to the pavement

- Cross the road safely & notice the potential hazards involved. Are there parked cars? Are there road markings that could present a hazard?

- Go to a road nearby and count the different types of vehicles going past for 2-3 mins. Are there more pedestrians, cars, buses, etc? If your meeting place is on a road, you could look out of the window instead. You could also do this in 2 different places e.g. a busy road and a quieter one and compare the difference. Does a quiet road make it any safer than a busy one? Do the busy roads near you have safe crossing points?

LET'S FUNDRAISE!

- Look at 'Brake', the charity that supports Road Safety. (www.brake.org.uk). Maybe you could sign up for one of Brake's Fundraisers and raise much needed funds for them!
- Hold a cake sale to raise money for a local children's hospital caring for victims of road traffic accidents
- Do some other sponsored activities to raise money for the two charities listed above. You could do a sponsored walk, skip, silence, the list is endless!

These clauses will cover the **Skills Builders Take Action Charity Challenge and Care About My Cause.**

LET'S PLAY!

- In small groups, act out how to cross the road safely: Using a zebra / pelican crossing, holding hands with an adult, looking & listening, waiting for the traffic to stop, etc
- On a dark evening, dress up in bright clothing & hide glow sticks around your meeting place for the girls to find. Talk about what makes it easier or harder to be seen in the dark
- Make a board game based on road safety & play it in small groups
- Play Traffic Lights
- Using toy phones, act out phoning the emergency services & practice what details you need to give when calling them
- Have a 'wheels' evening (this is also possible at a local park) where everyone brings an object with wheels on it. This opens up discussions about playing safely by the side of the road; particularly for the Rainbows that bring scooters or bikes
- Play 'duck, duck, goose' but change the names to things related to road safety
- Have a traffic light themed evening where everyone comes dressed in red, amber/yellow or green
- Come dressed as a pelican, zebra or puffin one evening to resemble the different road crossings

- Belt up a small teddy in a toy car. Put another teddy in a car without belting him/her up. Put both cars on a slope to show how important it is to wear your seatbelt. Teddy #1 is safe, Teddy #2 could fall out & get hurt
- Play road safety bingo details in the resources section
- Have a 'lights out' evening. Have a torch treasure hunt (see Roundabout the World resource), glow stick bowling, dress in reflective clothing, etc.
- Sing the Traffic Light Song. Could the girls make up their own song using a nursery rhyme tune like Frere Jacques?
- Play the Road Sign game, details in the resources section.

LET'S TAKE IT FURTHER!

- Learn the green cross code
- Explain how to cross roads safely
- Explain the meanings of some basic road signs
- Know which sign is which when shown a picture of them
- Write a poem or short story about road safety

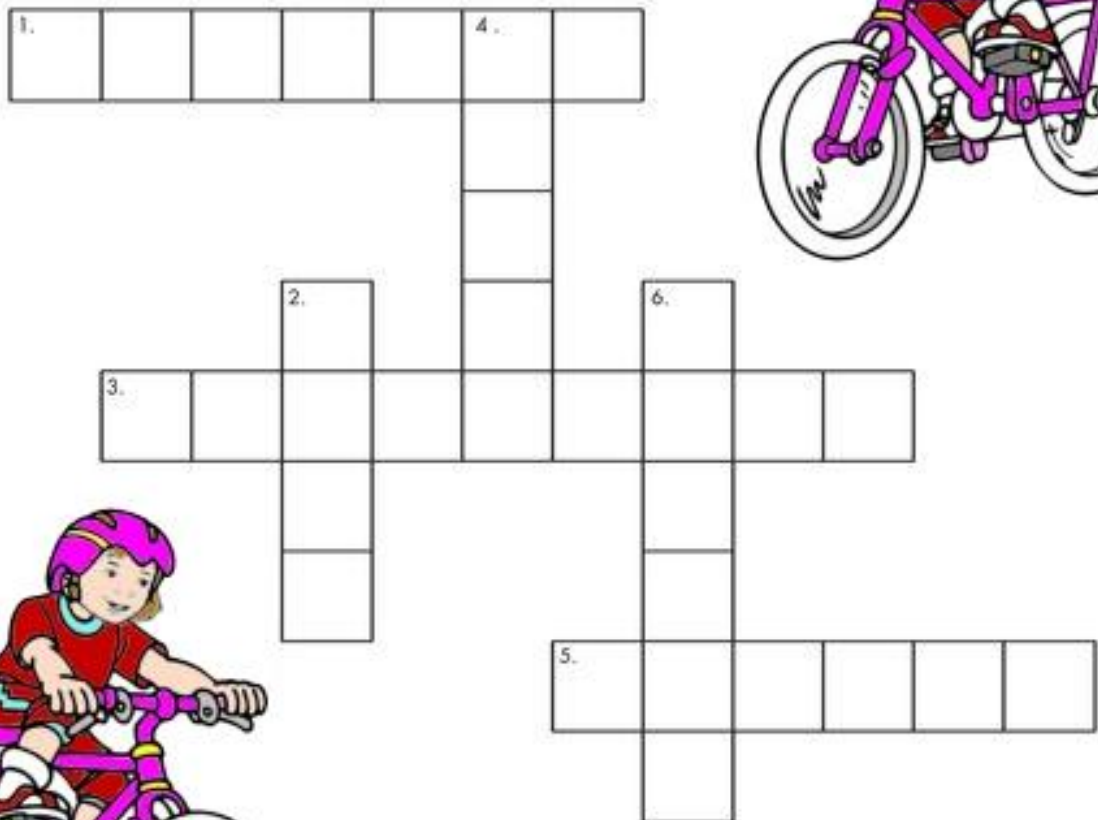

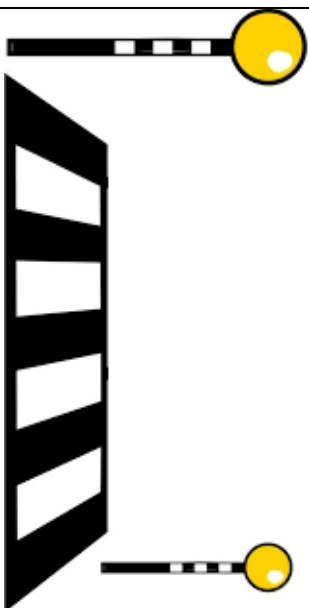


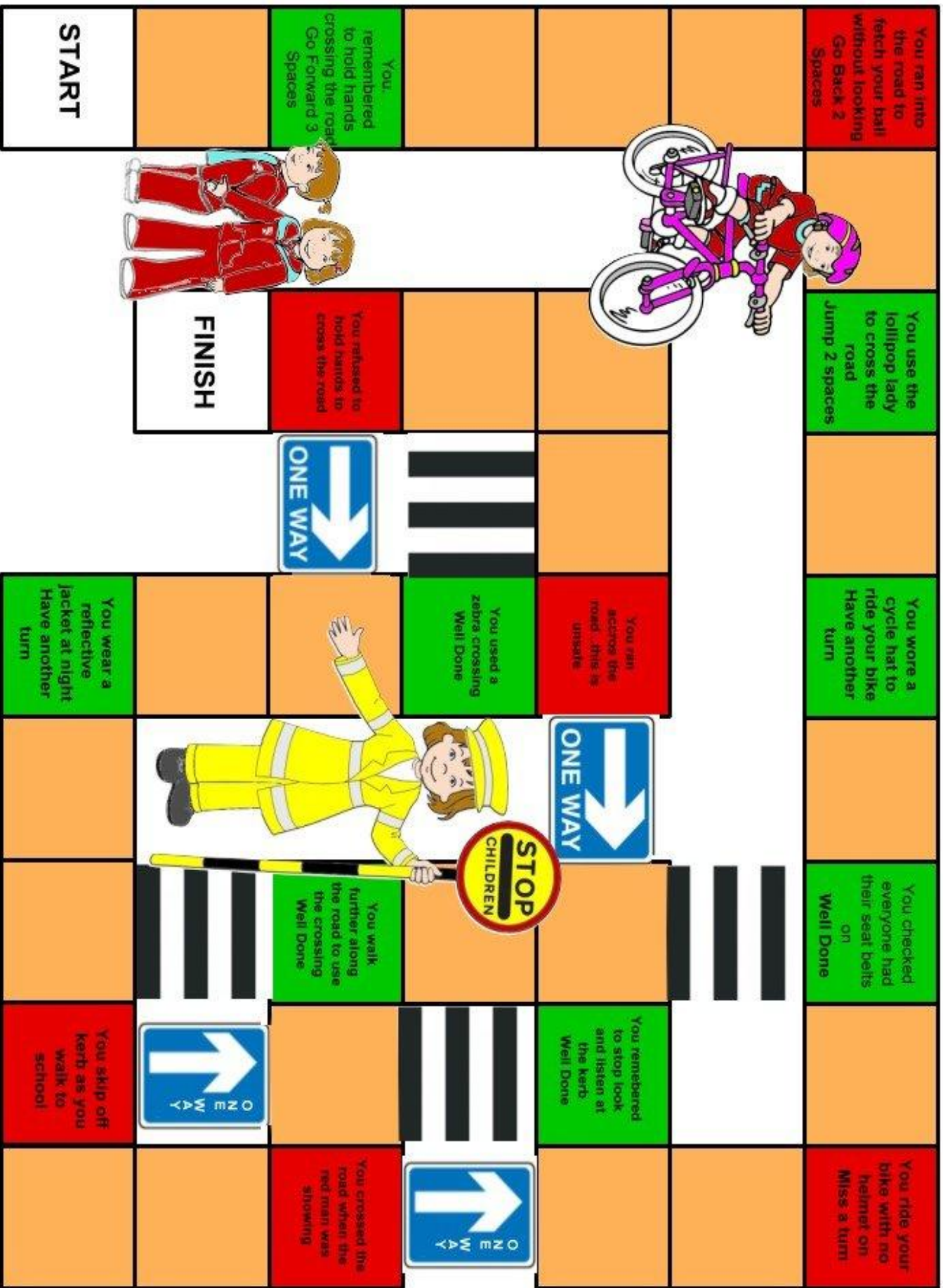

Design a Safety Hat For Olivia

Decorate/Colour in the way you like



Fitting a Bicycle Helmet Correctly-

- The helmet should sit level on your head; wear it low on your forehead, two fingers above the eyebrows.
- Adjust the plastic slider on both straps to form a "V" shape under your ears.
- Tighten the chin strap and adjust the pads inside so the helmet doesn't move.
- The helmet should fit snugly and must always be buckled—EACH time you ride.

The Spot It Road Safety Game

Spot It Road Safety consists of 30 cards, each showing 6 symbols.
Between any 2 cards there is always 1 - and only 1 - matching symbol.

You will need to print each disc on card and then we suggest laminating each card so that they can be used again.

To play as a Relay game.

Divide girls into teams. Each team will need a leader at the opposite side of the play area.

Give each leader one of the cards. Teams will stand at the other side of the play area and each girl will also have a card. Girl one runs to the leader and compares her card with the leaders, she has to spot the matching symbol. Once she has she runs back to her team and girl 2 runs up to find her matching symbol. First team with all their cards matched is the winner.

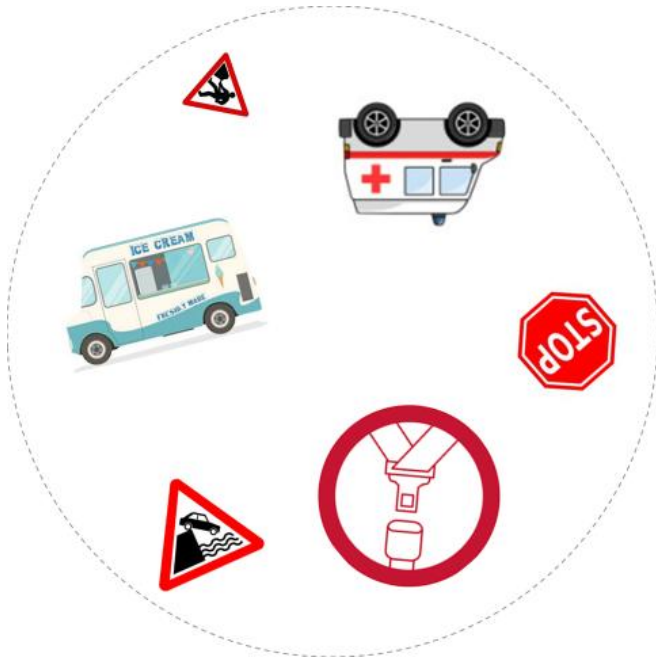
To play as a Tower game (3-6 players)

Deal 1 card to each player face down. Place the remaining cards face up in the middle of the table. Object of the game is to collect the most cards.

Simultaneously players flip their cards face up and try to spot the 1 symbol that appears on both the centre card and their own card. As soon as a player finds their match, they call it out. Then they take the top centre card and place it face up on top of their card to form a personal pile. Now they use the new top card on their personal pile to find a match with the new centre card.

Continue playing until the centre pile runs out of cards. The player with the most cards wins.











The Egg Experiment

Your will need:

2 small eggs

2 sandwich bags

2 strong elastic bands

1 Styrofoam ball big enough to contain one of the eggs.



Discuss with the Rainbows why cycle helmets are important to wear whenever they use something with wheels, like skateboards, roller skates, cycles.

For the purposes of this experiment the egg is our heads, the outer fragile shell is our skull and the inside of the egg is our brain.

Take 1 egg and put it in a sandwich bag and tie tightly (this is to avoid mess) Drop the egg onto a hard surface, like the floor, from about 6inches. Did it break? If not increase the height and drop until it does. Potentially this is what happens to our head if it come into sudden contact with a hard surface like a road/pavement etc.

Now take the Styrofoam ball, cut it in half and scoop out enough beads of polystyrene to be able to insert the egg. Close the ball around the egg using the elastic bands criss crossed to hold in place. Place in a sandwich bag. Now repeat the experiment, at what height did the egg break or didn't it?

The Styrofoam absorbed the energy of the impact generated by the egg's fall. A similar result occurs when you fall and hit your head while wearing a bicycle helmet; the Styrofoam in the helmet helps absorb some of the shock from the fall and protects your head against injury.
